PROGRESS REPORTS CARDS

On Tuesday, November 15, your child will be receiving either their Kindergarten Communication of Learning (KCL) report, or their Progress Report, if they are in Grades One through Six.

If you are a new family to the TDSB, the November reports contain comments and indicators regarding your child's academic growth and development to this point in the school year, but they do not contain grades or marks. The Term 1 Report Cards, which go home in mid

February, will have letter grades, for students in grades 1-6.

This year teachers have been learning to use a new electronic application for writing report cards. There have been some glitches and growing pains along the way, but we are navigating as best as we can.

Because of complications with learning and utilizing the new platform, the report cards will focus on a few areas of strength and areas for growth and next steps. The report card will not be as robust as in the past. However, this is temporary for this reporting period only.

All parents are welcome and encouraged to meet with their child's teacher(s) during the week of November 14th when interviews will be scheduled. The evening of Thursday, November 17 and the morning of Friday, November 18 are specifically identified as interview times for teachers and parents.

OOOPS CONSTRUCTIONThe Field is Open!

The field is green, it is lush, it is ready for action. During Harvest Fest, the students were able to use the field for first time since June! The field was entirely excavated and rebuilt to improve drainage and maximize every inch for play. Students will access the field during school hours by walking along a dedicated path which hugs the south side of the schoolyard.

The students are also able to use the primay play structure and the area in front of the terraced gardens including the blue basketball courts. We are slowly getting access to our restored yard.

With asphalt still to lay, a new basketball area to install, a boardwalk to build (and more!), construction continues.

What is next?

The tremendous construction team is working as quickly as they can to prepare more sections of the grounds for play. We have regular site visits from the landscape architects and Toronto District School Board to make sure things are progressing and to solve any impasses. I will update you as soon as I know about the next phase of opening.

Read on for history:

It's been four decades since OOOPS' outdoor infrastructure was last improved.

This OOOPS Greens project was four years in development, is informed by parent, student and community input and supported by tremendous fundraising.

We are now:

- preserving the great trees, and planting more than two dozen new ones;
- addressing the perennial flooding issues caused, in part, by the not-to-be-forgotten Garrison Creek;
- making the whole terrain more accessible, sustainable, and safe; and,
- adding features to promote outdoor education and play including more seating, a theatre platform, basketball hoops, and a path around the field.
