EXTRA-CURRICULAR POLICY

Parkdale CI offers a wide range of opportunities for students to become involved in Extra-Curricular activities. School involvement enhances the student's sense of belonging and school spirit, and promotes social, emotional and physical well-being. All students are encouraged to participate in the rich Extra-Curricular life at Parkdale.

In order to be eligible to participate in Extra-Curricular activities, PCI students MUST:

• be a current FULL TIME PCI student;

- have a current Student Activity Card;
- based on the midterm report card each semester, be passing 3 of 4 courses or be cooperating with recommendations for support and improvement from Administration and/or IST/SST;
- demonstrate good attendance and punctuality for all classes on their timetable;
- attend all scheduled classes on the day of a game/activity;
- adhere to the PCI Code of Conduct and the TDSB Code of Behaviour for Athletes (in the TDSB Common Pages);
- be in good standing at school students suspended from school must not be on TDSB property for the duration of the suspension;
- be responsible for all work covered and assignments given during any classes missed for athletics or other co-curricular activities.

Exceptional circumstances will be considered by Coaches, Staff Advisors and Administration on an individual basis.

SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Spectators are an important aspect of school athletic events and serve to complement the experience of all those involved in sporting competitions. **WE WELCOME STAFF MEMBERS AS SPECTATORS AT ALL TIMES!!!**

Parents and guardians are welcome to attend home games when supervision for spectators has been arranged. As visitors to the school, parents and guardians must sign in at the Main Office to receive a Visitor's Pass. Only Parkdale CI students and families may spectate at home games. Students must show their student photo ID card to gain admission to these events.

Parkdale CI students are not permitted to attend athletic events to spectate when PCI teams are guests at other schools except for semi-final and championship matches when **proper supervision has been arranged by administration**.

It is expected that all spectators will:

- cheer in a positive manner;
- respect the decisions of the officials;
- respect the athletic facilities and property;
- respect the authority of the TDSB staff members who are supervising games;
- be courteous and respectful to fellow spectators;
- not interfere with the game in any manner;
- refrain from the use of profanity, taunting, threatening actions, or violence;
- behave in accordance with and subject to all TDSB policies and Codes of Conduct;
- leave the event in a quick and orderly fashion upon completion of the game.

Spectators who are unable to meet the above expectations will be asked to leave and may be subject to further discipline according to their school's Code of Conduct.

LIBRARY LEARNING COMMONS
