Qunar New Year (Tina F.)

Park Lane celebrated the Lunar New Year with a virtual lesson hosted by Elizabeth and Yan. Students and staff at home and in person shared a variety of things from China such as: fans, flags, clothes, foods, decorations, and ceramics. Everyone was encouraged to dress up in traditional outfits or wear the colours of the Chinese flag (red and yellow). We also learned about similarities and subtle differences in how the New Year is celebrated in China and Korea. Virtual lesson participants listened to celebratory songs about wishing others a healthy and prosperous year ahead. Everyone also enjoyed watching videos of previous Park Lane Lunar Celebrations & gatherings. Students made red and yellow lanterns to illuminate the new year ahead. Room 2 created a sensory table at the front of the school with traditional decorations and customary items for students to explore.











African Heritage Month Celebration (Hibo Q.)

Black History Month takes place every February at the TDSB. During this month, we look at the past and present to recognize and gain a better understanding of Black History as well as celebrate traditions and accomplishments of the African Heritage community. It is important to recognize Black History Month as it was created to understand the hardships black people have had to endure in order to be recognized as equal in society; which is a movement that continues today. Black History is also not simply from the past. It is important to understand how recent prominent world leaders like the late Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., had dreams and set up foundations for activists to continue the work in order to see means of change.

This year, African Heritage Month at Park Lane was celebrated through beautiful traditional pieces used by many African nations. We set up a display in honour of Black History Month. Through the virtual lessons, we visited Kenya and Ghana and learned about their beautiful traditions. During classroom and virtual lessons, we explored countries like Ghana, Kenya, Trinidad and Tobago. The students also got dressed up in traditional clothing and played with sensory books based on African culture. We watched the Lion King and encouraged staff and students to listen to Anansi stories, play drums and watch the animals roam the Masai Mara lands. Tamil Heritage (Jonita E.)

Greeting (Vanakkam)! January marks the celebration of Thai Pongal, a Tamil harvest festival. This year's themes are: Truth, Rights, and Unity. This year's Tamil Values are: Hospitality, Duty, Upholding Character, Respecting Elders, Maintaining Discipline, Gratitude, and Truthfulness.

In Park Lane, we celebrated Tamil Heritage month by displaying Nirai-kudam (full pot); used when Tamils have their celebrations. Each part has a significant meaning behind it: a coconut represents a human head, The 5 Mango leaves represent the 5 senses, a pot with water represents water in the human body, rice represents the earth Finally, lamps cure ignorance.

We also celebrated by creating Tamil art pieces and displaying students' names written in Tamil throughout the hallway.

Fun facts about Tamil heritage include: Tamil is more than 2000 years old and there are a significant number of Tamil speakers in: Australia, Canada, Fiji, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Mauritius, Myanmar, Réunion, Singapore, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Switzerland, United Kingdom, and in the United States of America.

Tamils believe that piercing ears helps in the development of intellect, power of thinking, and decision making. Since ancient times, Tamils believe that on the forehead between the two eyebrows is a spot considered a major nerve point in the human body. The Pottu is believed to prevent the loss of "energy "from this area. The red 'kungumam' between the eyebrows is said to retain energy in the human body and control the various levels of concentration.
