Experiential Learning program at Park Lane (Anju P.)

Park Lane started off the recycling and seasonal jobs program Wednesday, October 28 Day, so the students can have more job embedded opportunities. Four classes (Rooms 1, 5, 8 and 9) have signed up for the program; Classes will have their own classroom chart and will decide which student will take part in the recycling program.

The goal of all four classes is that we want our students to be engaged and independent to their full potential. These job embedded activities will meet the goals for communication and other subject area. The recycling program will run throughout the year along with other seasonal jobs: Winter, shoveling the driveway, throwing the salt, spring, cleaning the yard, planting and watering the plants.

Room 5; also designed a program for the students to manage in the community to increase students' self-regulation and social skills (e.g., TTC training and life skills beyond school and community recreation opportunities). By participating in the Experiential Learning Program, students will be more familiar with community services (e.g., TTC, libraries, malls, grocery stores and bowling alleys) which will increase students' functional academics, self-regulation, social and communication skills.

The students will demonstrate how to cope in different social settings by accessing the community services. They will learn to demonstrate appropriate behaviour when taking the TTC, using tokens, eating in the food court, making a grocery list, locating items on shelves, choosing grocery items from the list and exchanging money to buy the items. The next day students will participate in a cooking program by learning food preparation and cooking their lunch.
