I am wishing you a wonderful week and month ahead. During 'off times' please take time away from the computer screen as much as possible. So far winter is giving us a 'break' and the outdoor temperatures are perfect for fresh air and winter walks.

The Government of Ontario announced new measures to help slow the spread of COVID-19 in the province. As part of this week's announcement, the government has said that all schools in Toronto will remain closed to students and staff until Wednesday, February 10. During the closure period, remote learning will continue, as will in-person supports for students with special education needs who

cannot be accommodated through remote learning.

Our schools will continue to support all families to ensure that learning can continue as best as possible during the closure, although we recognize that everyone is trying their best to balance life, work, childcare, and remote learning, among other things right now. While we believe the continuation of learning is important, the mental health and well-being of our students is just as important. We would encourage parents/guardians to review these important resources that we have compiled that may help support during your children this challenging period.

# FRENCH PROGRAMS APPLICATION DEADLINE

For families interested in the Toronto District School Board's system-wide French Programs, we offer an online process to apply for Early French Immersion (begins in Senior Kindergarten) and Middle French Immersion (begins in Grade 4). An offer of placement in the program (not a specific school) is guaranteed to all on-time applicants. The timelines for applying for these programs for September 2021 are:

#### Middle French Immersion:

Applications must be completed online between January 4 and January 29, 2021.

Offers of placement within your chosen program (not a specific school) will be made to all on-time applicants in the weeks following the close of the application window. Families with an older sibling currently in a French program are still required to complete an online application for the new student.

Grade 7 Extended French program: students who have successfully completed three years of Core French the option to enter into a more intensive program in Grade 7. These students spend approximately 40% of their day in French classes at the Extended French school. While the TDSB has decided to phase out this program, the last cohort to begin the Grade 7 entry Extended French starts in September 2022. The Grade 7 Extended French program is offered in only 14 schools in the TDSB. The attendance area for an Extended French school is created by "associated" English feeder schools. J.R. Wilcox C.S. is your child's school for Grade 7 Extended French.
