A: There's a ratio student/teacher. Consequences are multi-tiered. There could be suspensions. If there is an assault, then it is a police matter.</li> </ul>

Ms. Chan: The main intention of notifications is to offer support. There's a lot of conversation about sending or not sending a letter. There are very few things I have discretion with.
