		need to decide where we are going. The board
		doesn't know where it is going. King is not alone.
		We are doing our best to adapt.
		through the portfolio and interview and didn't
		benefit from the program?
		 Mr W: King this year is better than last year. We are
		doing our best to give them opportunities.
		 Ms. Ch: The limiting factor is, as always, funds.
		 Mr W: Regarding speakers, if you or someone you
		know is in a position of leadership, pass that
		information to us, because we'd love to get in
		contact with you.
