

- 1 Health and Physical Education
- 0.5 Civics
- 0.5 Career Studies






PATHWAYS IN ENGLISH




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

Take this process seriously...

> The courses that you select will drive the number of sections and staffing

- In the first week of September the only changes that will be made are for:
- Student does not have the prerequisite for the course
- Change in level of difficulty
- Course required as prerequisite for Post Secondary program
- > Many courses do end up with waitlists!



Planning on taking a course during the summer?

- If you are 110% sure you are taking a course during the summer **do not** choose it as part of your plan on **myblueprint**.
- If you were planning on taking a compulsory course (ie Careers/Civics or History) please use the comments section in myblueprint to indicate this.

May not be successful in a course?

If the course you failed is a requirement for next year such as Math, Science, English, French your timetable will be changed for next year. Only with the completion of the summer school course will the Grade 10 course be added.

Remember some courses are not offered in summer school...

Summer school information becomes available in April, register **online** in early May...spaces are limited!
