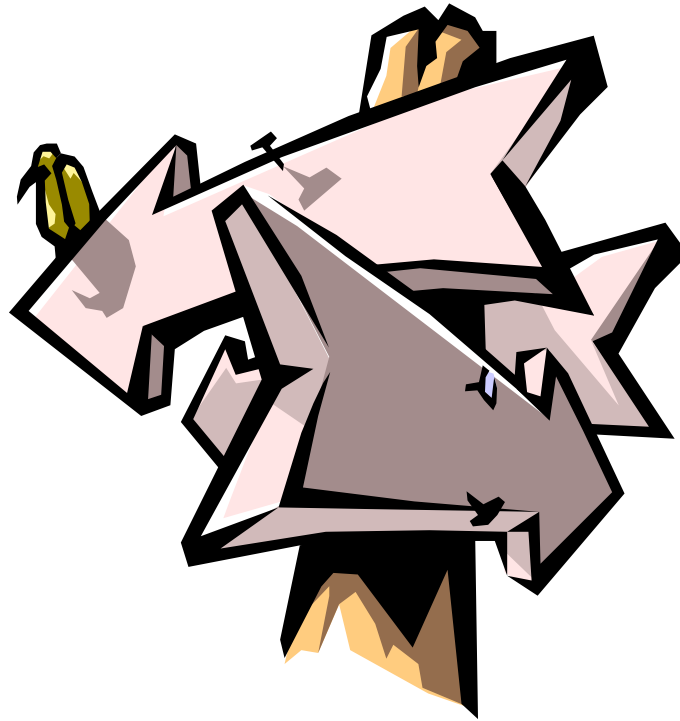

Course Selection Considerations



- **O.S.S.D.** Ministry graduation requirements:
minimum 30 credits; 18 compulsory credits

Check your credit counselling summary CCS

- **French Immersion Certificate**

10 credits; 11+ credits Honours

- **Extended French Certificate**

7 credits; 8+ credits Honours

- Pre-requisites to courses in grade 11 and grade 12

- Student's interest and aptitude in subject areas

Grade 12 course pre-requisites for university or college will determine type of courses needed in grade 11





Compulsory Credits

Students must earn the following 15 compulsory credits:

- **4 English - one credit per grade**
- **1 French as a second language**
- **3 Mathematics - at least one in grade 11 or 12**
- **2 Science**
- **1 Canadian History**
- **1 Canadian Geography**
- **1 Arts (*Visual Arts, Music or Drama*)**
- **1 Health and Physical Education**
- **0.5 Civics**
- **0.5 Career Studies**



Compulsory Credits

Plus One Credit From Each Of The Following Groups:

Group 1

- additional credit in English, or French, or a third language (Spanish), or Social Sciences and Humanities, or Canadian and World Studies, or Guidance and Career Education, or Cooperative Education

Group 2

- additional credit in Health and Physical Education, or the Arts, or French, or Business Studies, or Cooperative Education

Group 3

- additional credit in Science at the senior level, or Technological Education, or Computer Science, or Cooperative Education or French

For a total of 18 compulsory credits

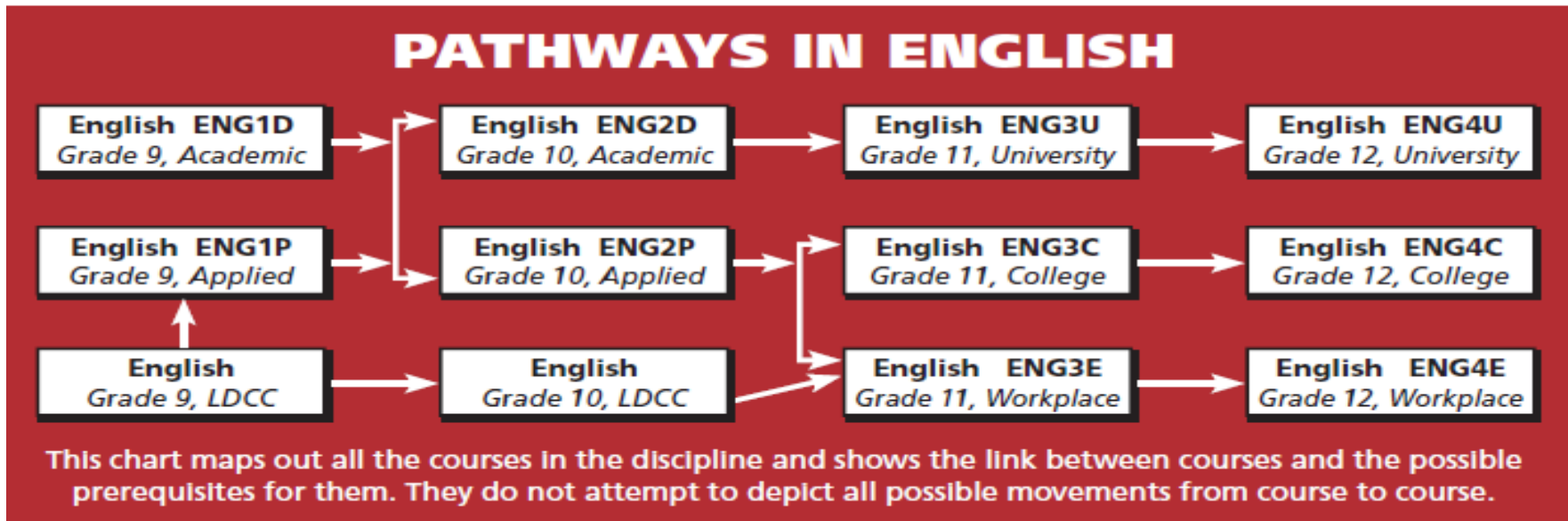

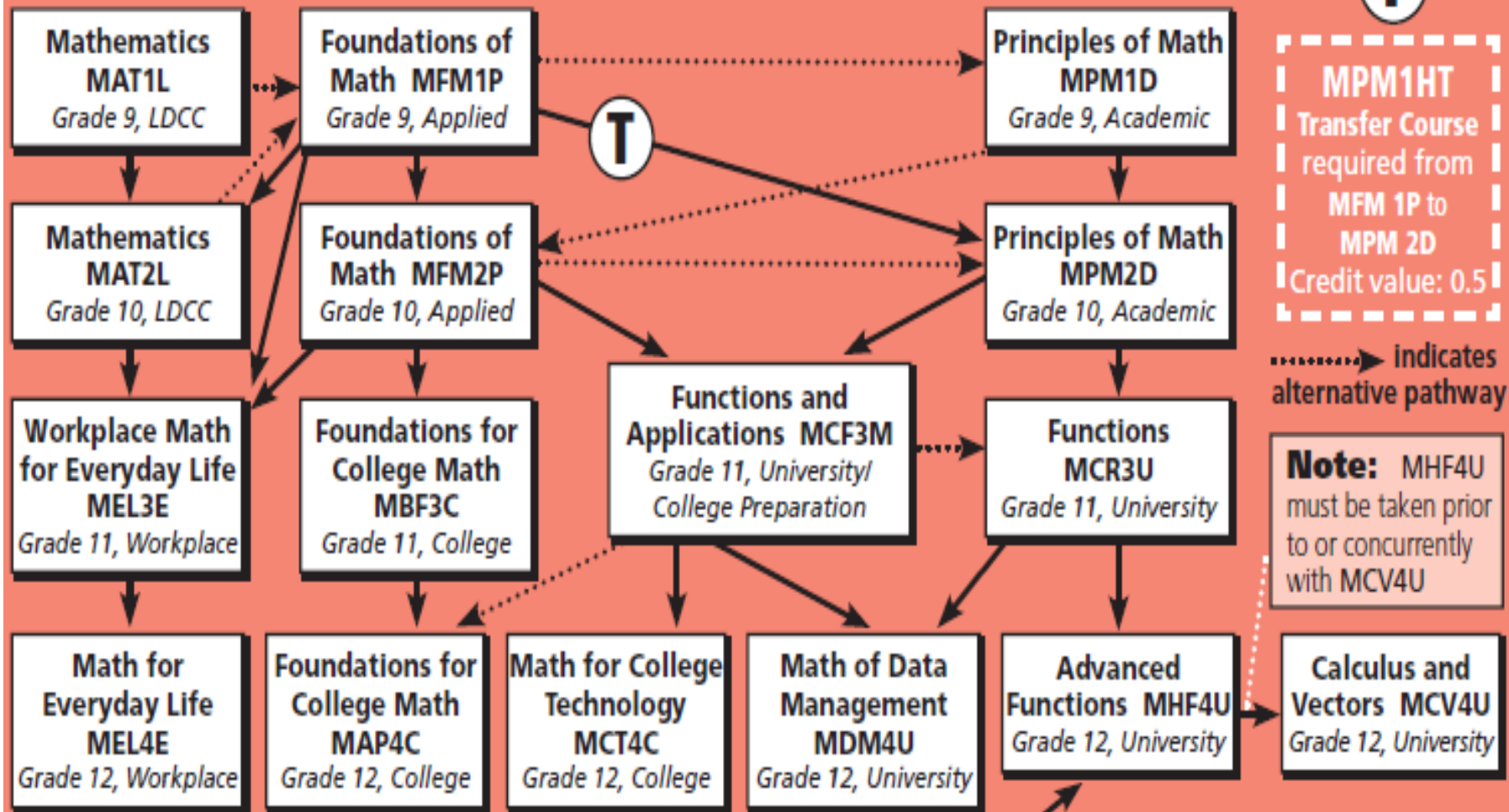

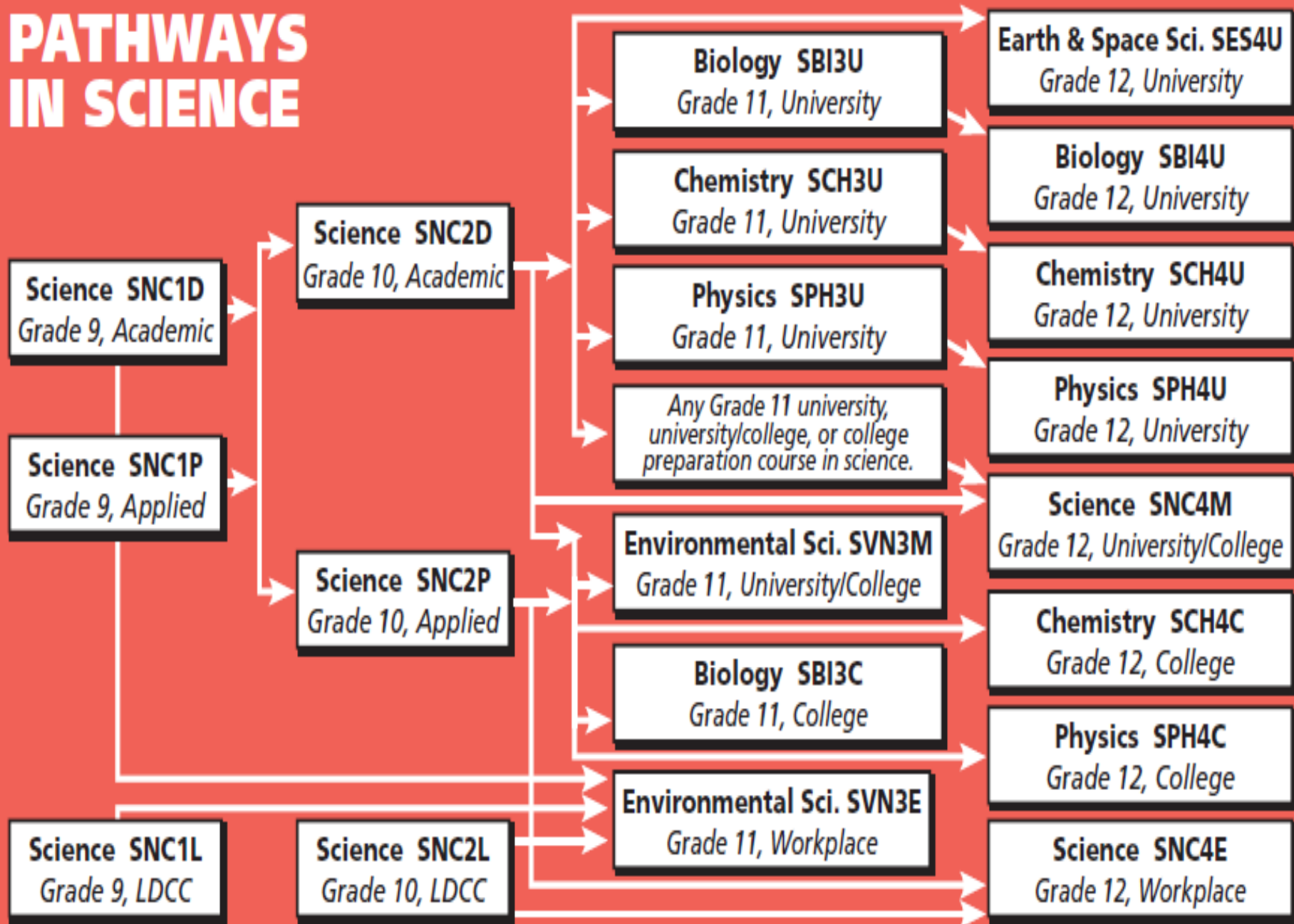

An interactive approach to education planning that is both simple to navigate and proven effective.

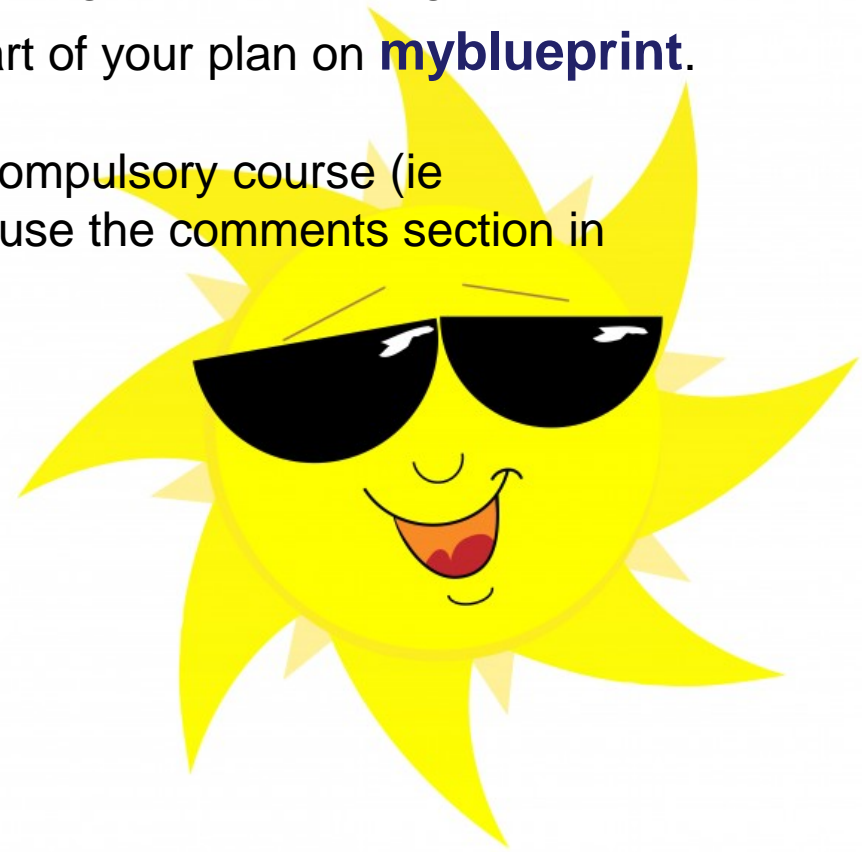
Take this process seriously...

- The courses that you select will drive the number of sections and staffing
- In the first week of September the only changes that will be made are for:
 - Student does not have the prerequisite for the course
 - Change in level of difficulty
 - Course required as prerequisite for Post Secondary program
- Many courses do end up with waitlists!



Planning on taking a course during the summer?

- If you are **100%** sure you are taking a course during the summer **do not** choose it as part of your plan on **myblueprint**.
- If you were planning on taking a compulsory course (ie Careers/Civics or History) please use the comments section in **myblueprint** to indicate this.





May not be successful in a course?

If the course you failed is a requirement for next year such as Math, Science, English, French **your timetable will be changed for next year**. Only with the completion of the summer school course will the Grade 10 course be added.

Remember some courses are not offered in summer school...

Summer school information becomes available in April, register **online** in early May...spaces are limited!
