





Tips for success Extended French and French Immersion at RCI

- A genuine interest in pursuing French studies
- An average of at least <u>60% in Grade 8</u> Extended
 French or French Immersion courses
- Good study habits
- Subscribe to French publications
- Participate in extra-curricular activities such as conferences, contests, ceremonies, clubs, exchanges, cultural outings

NB — RCI is unable to accommodate a switch from French to English unless you reside inside of our English Catchment area.

Admissions Process

- Students in French Immersion (FI) from our feeder schools (Hilltop and John English) who live in Richview's French Immersion catchment area will complete course selection with their Grade 8 Guidance Counsellor
- Students in Extended French (EF) from our feeder schools (Bloorlea, Hilltop and Greenholme) who live in Richview's Extended French Immersion catchment area will complete course selection with their Grade 8 Guidance Counsellor
- Students who attend these schools, but are not in our FI/EF catchment area will need to complete an optional attendance form.
- Students in FI or EF from Non-feeder schools (private or TCDSB), who live in the RCI school catchment area will be able to pick up an application form tonight for Late Entry consideration. This does <u>NOT</u> guarantee admission.
