- 1 additional credit in Science (grade 11 or 12), or Technological Education (grade 9 to 12), French or Cooperative Education

Admissions Process

The TDSB has determined that Richview is CLOSED to Optional Attendance for the 2022-23 year for ALL programs.

- Students in French Immersion (FI) from our feeder schools (Hilltop, John English, Second Street, Islington, & Melody Village) who live in Richview's FI catchment area will complete course selection with their Grade 8 teachers through MyBlueprint
- Students in Extended French (EF) from our feeder schools (Bloorlea, Greenholme, Second Street) who live in Richview's Extended French Immersion catchment area will complete course selection with their Grade 8 teachers through MyBlueprint
- Students in FI or EF from Non-feeder schools (private or TCDSB), who live in the RCI school catchment area <u>may</u> be able to access an application form on our website for **Late Entry** consideration. This does <u>NOT</u> guarantee admission.
