## FUNDRAISING - Crooked Cue/Silent Auction/Donor Gifts (October 2023)

- Food \& Nutrition Class - 4 ovens (anonymous donor $\$ 6,000.00$ )
- Muskoka Woods support (same anonymous donor $\$ 6,000.00$ )
- Physical Education - new equipment for the gym/school-wide use $(5,000.00)$
- Math - ordered new equipment to enhance teaching (over $\$ 10,000.00$ )

NOTE: In 2022, Golf Canada gave RCI a $\$ 25,000.00$ donation which we used to offset the $\$ 30,000.00$ reduction in our school budget. These funds helped with the Muskoka Woods excursion in 2023 (to cover Supply Teachers). They did not cover the construction for the new parking lot; this was paid for by TDSB.

## Also discussed during the PRINCIPAL'S Update:

- A question was asked about TDSB trustees recently voting to develop a policy to limit the use of cell phones in class
- No specific outcomes as of yet
- Hard for staff to compete with cell phones, they are out in every class
- Lucie confirmed that if a student does not have an exam on a day during exam week, the student does not have school that day
- The exam schedule is included in the Principal's Update
- Lucie confirmed that January $31^{\text {st }}$ is a half day
- Students will receive their final marks from the first semester, should come to school on the $31^{\text {st }}$ even if they have no exams
- Schedules for second semester should be out within a week
- Lucie is very grateful for the help of volunteers this year
- For example, volunteers are already compiling the results of today's literacy test
- A new male hall monitor has just started, 0.5 time allocated to Richview Cl
- Very helpful when checking on the boy's washrooms


## STAFF UPDATE: Michael Colbert (Math)

- Staff says they are exhausted, overworked
- This semester was the first time he was able cover the entire grade 9 math curriculum
- EQAO testing taking place today and tomorrow for Grade 9 students
- It now comprises $10 \%$ of the student's final English mark
- Michael is concerned that students are not sufficiently focused when taking the EQAO
- Could be taking the test on a computer makes a student less focused, or perhaps it is the multiple choice format
- He wishes the students good luck on their exams and summatives
- The load from exams and summatives is lighter for lower grades when compared to the much heavier load for higher grades
- Higher grade students could be a positive influence for lower grades
- Bathrooms are a hang-out spot
- Some of the more senior students are missing period one, they should take things more seriously
- Waterloo math contests for Grades 9-11 are Wednesday February $28^{\text {th }}$, during Muskoka Woods
- Considering how best to address for students away at Muskoka Woods
- Some students also wrote a math contest during the first semester, Richview Cl has received the results and certificates are being prepared for the students who wrote.
- Preparing for an indoor track meet on March $1^{\text {st }}$, outdoor track and field begins in April


## CHAIR'S REPORT: Maria Skinner and Caroline Cho

- Krista agreed to lead the Staff Appreciation breakfast
- Will reach out to Lucie to set a date, likely a late start Wednesday, possibly in April
- Graduation for the Grade 12 s will be held June $27^{\text {th }}$ at the Woodbine Banquet and Convention Hall
- Same venue as last year
- Prior to the event Council helps compile and hand out gowns and sashes
- At the event volunteers hands out programs, provide snacks, etc
- Maria agreed to lead the Council's graduation activities
- Krista, Noel and others will help
- School Council has a SQUARE reader, which enables the Council to accept payments at fundraising events via credit card and other forms of electronic payment
- Have been issues in the past with properly using the reader, making it more difficult to reconcile dollar figures
- For now Ryan will keep the SQUARE reader until she has been able to give Kathy a tutorial
- Kathy also suggested a tutorial each school year for anyone who will be using the SQUARE reader
- Council gave its Richview CI Decals to the Small Business Club to sell at Grade 8 night \& market
- The Council discussed the possibility of a fundraiser for the remaining Phys Ed ask from the November Council meeting, exact numbers updated following the meeting
- By way of background, at the November Council meeting:
- $\$ 15,000$ of the funds raised from the Social were allocated by Council
- Lucie provided two potential wishlists, from the Math and the Physical Education Departments
- The ask from Math totaled $\$ 10,123$, the ask from Phys Ed totaled \$12,593.50
- After some discussion, Council allocated $\$ 10,123$ to the Math Department, the remaining $\$ 4,877$ was provided to the Physical Education department
- For a total allocated of $\$ 15,000$
- The allocation to Phys Ed was $\$ 7,716.50$ short of their wishlist cost
- See the table below for a summary of how the $\$ 15,000$ was allocated

- Council currently has $\$ 4,024.17$ in its account
- Some of this amount is earmarked for other purposes
- The Poinsettia drive raised $\$ 1,035$, this is earmarked for Graduation

■ Council would also want to carry $\$ 500$ over to the next school year

- This leaves $\$ 2,489.17$ in the account that could be provided to Phys Ed

■ If the remaining $\$ 2,489.17$ was provided to Phys End this would reduce the shortfall to $\$ 5,227.33$

- Council discussed how best to raise additional funds for Phys Ed

■ Dima will look into a potential Spring Flower Fundraiser ie planters

- Krista will send a potential contact to Dima
- Ryan mentioned that Big Yellow Bag garden soil also has a school fundraising program
- Noel suggested selling tickets to a Lobster Roast

■ He highlighted that food-oriented events tend to bring people together

- Lucia suggested doing a direct ask to the community
- After the asks associated with the Social, there was a reluctance to do another direct ask

O Marie said we should share more broadly how the money raised from the Social was spent, not just in the Council minutes

■ She would like to ensure that we are clear about how the money raised has been spent thus far

- Ryan could post to social media
- Ryan pointed out that Mr Ragno has contacts/corporate donors who match the SickKids donation drive
- For example, Lucie mentioned they do reach out to corporate donors for yearbooks
- Michael suggested a soccer fundraising event
- In the spring, at Richview Cl when playing Etobicoke Cl
- Krista expressed an interest in running the Concessions Stand during this and possibly other spring sporting events at Richview Cl
- Potential spring fundraiser will be left with Dima
- perhaps will roll over a shortfall for next year
- or accept that we do not have enough funds to fulfill all of the ask from the Physical Education department
- Worth noting that there will be more asks from various departments in the future
- Karin proposed setting criteria for prioritizing requests from the school going forward
- Such as the requests from the Math and Physical Education departments above
- For example, perhaps one criteria could be related to how many students would benefit, the more the better
- At this time the Council by-laws are silent on this subject
- The TDSB guidelines do provide some guidance on how funds raised by school councils may be used, for example complementing the budget
- There is also a list of what these funds cannot be used for
- Karin is looking for a way to prioritize requests, not necessarily to constrain how funds raised can or cannot be used
- Council currently assumes it has been prioritized by the school before Council receives the request


## Also discussed during the Chair's Report

- Caroline asked what happened to items not bid on at the Social
- Three items are left over, currently in Marie's basement
- Caroline suggested they be donated for school clubs for auctioning, Marie was supportive
- A question asked about improving the school's sports field and track
- Back in 2016 an initiative set out to raise $\$ 5$ million for the sports field, thus far \$0 has been raised
- Etobicoke Cl got a new field due to one large donor and their donation of \$2 million
- Lucia has talked to the school councillor, could try to get funds from the province's infrastructure minister
- We would need to put pressure on the school trustee to go to the province to fund
- TDSB no longer permits school fields to be rented out
- Noel mentioned the possibility of reaching out to corporations such as MLSE to help fund, but this would need sufficient support from the community
- Kathy pointed out how active the school is for athletics
- If we were to reach out to corporations we would also need to show that we had been raising money
- Lucie highlighted that the school has other capital requirements
- For example, when it rains water comes into the school offices
- Given that raising funds to improve the sport field would likely be a multi-year endeavour, Karin said that if Council began raising funds for the sports field a separate capital account could be set up so the money raised could not then be repurposed in later years by subsequent student councils


## STUDENT COUNCIL UPDATE: Alex Picket

- Busy time for students due to pending summative and exam season
- One student council meeting in January thus far
- December Richview Merch Sale was very successful
- best seller was the white quarter-zip top
- Also held the Braeburn Toy Drive
- Toys were happily received by children in the Braeburn community
- Late donations were provided to the fire station neighbouring Richview Cl


## Also discussed during the Student Council Update:

- Caroline heard the Business Club is doing a second Arts \& Craft sale , the first was quite successful
- A question was asked if there were plans for a semi-formal
- Not yet decided, student body would very much like one


## TREASURER'S REPORT: Kathy DaSilva

- A new account was opened at TD in November
- the Council's funds have been moved to TD
- all transactions now going into the new account
- the monthly fee for the TD account is $\$ 4.95$, much better than at Alterna
- Instructions have been provided to Alterna to close our previous account
- awaiting a letter from Alterna to confirm the account's closure
- The current balance at TD is $\$ 4,024.17$
- When we opened the previous account, the associated financial institution had been PACE Credit Union
- When PACE went under, Alterna acquired the majority of PACE's assets
- When the PACE account was opened the Council was required to put $\$ 200$ into an investment, Council is not sure where this investment is now
- Karin suggested filing a claim with the CDIC (Canada Deposit Insurance Corporation)


## GENDER EQUITY in the SPORT PROGRAM: Kelly Brown

- Kelly raised a concern about gender equity across sports teams at Richview Cl
- For example:
- This is no indoor soccer for girls, just for boys
- While there was a girl football player this past season, football is not a gender equitable sport
- Kelly would like the school to create a list of all the sports teams for the year that are sanctioned through TDSB competitions, and indicate which have resources (budget and a coach), and which do not
- And then have a conversation at Council to review any gaps and discuss with the school what actions we can take to ensure better equity
- Lucie highlighted that coaching is voluntary for all staff members, we rely on volunteers to coach sports teams
- Kathy said that given coaching is voluntary, it could be tough to ensure equity across all sports
- Michael strongly agreed that we need to promote girl's sports more
- $1 / 3$ of staff is new to the school, makes it harder to find volunteers


## Also discussed during the Gender Equity in Sports item:

- Dima said that there were no tryouts this year for indoor soccer
- Very frustrating for students who would like to potentially compete on these teams
- Lucie checked after the meeting, the Physical Education department held two tryouts for indoor soccer
