4. Principal/Vice-Principal's Report – Mr. Wilson and Mrs. Irving

Mr. Wilson:

- Scholastic Book Fair success. Holiday sing along before winter break.
- Author visit spoke to grade 6 re: The St. Louis ship/Holocaust education
- Term 1 report based on Sept to mid January PA Day Jan 19th for teachers to work on report cards. Parent teacher interviews Thursday February 15th (PM), Friday February 16th (AM).

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- December holiday singalong was a big success kindergarten/primary/senior. Door decorating for winter.
- School council provided a breakfast for the teachers before the winter holidays. Thank you!
- Upcoming activities: Ms. Papas and Ms. Kozierok basketball and volleyball for grade 6s at lunch. Will add grade 5s if there is interest. Ms. Papas is doing a guitar club. Mr. Lovell is putting together a junior choir (grade 4-6). Ms. Pineta is putting together a friendship club groups of 10 kids who will sit and talk about stories. Mila (settlement worker) does arts and crafts on Wednesdays at lunch to help newcomers talk and interact with others.

5. Rockford Community Issues

a. East passage "swamp":

Area was leveled off several years ago (~3) however it now gets swampy and floods again. Becomes ice/slush when the temperature drops.

High traffic, narrow area, limited sunlight. Mr. Wilson will follow up with TDSB facilities.

b. Schoolyard - salting before school?

Several children have slipped on the ice in the back. Can salting be done earlier in the day?

There is a path that the caretaker is required to follow re: salting. The middle of the backyard isn't part of the path. Caution tape has been put up in the areas that are full of ice.

Parents to walk on the path area for safety, don't cut across the yard. The path is down to bare pavement. Mr. Wilson will send an email to the parents re: the path.

d. Staff Rep

- Budget requests
 - Newcomer information night food, childcare, parent council reps to share information.
 - Kelly Hand requested books, resources and PD for literacy development with the new curriculum.
 - 60 books per class X 6 classes (\$3,600 + tax) for kindergarten book bags (+French immersion classes) – they will look into costs of French books too and come back with a full estimate.
 - Grade 6 class going on a field trip for an author event – may need bus funding.
 - Teachers are looking into field trips. Timing of bus availability is a big challenge as the buses can't pick up before school day route is complete and must return field trip students before the bus is needed for a school route.

7. Winte<mark>r</mark> Events

Movie Nights – the children can bring a blanket and pillow for watching. School council sell chips, juice boxes etc. for fundraising. TDSB has license for video distributers (for classroom viewing – can this be transferred to the parent council for a movie night?). We may need to split Jr/Primary for movie and due to number of students at the school vs. gym space. Parent/caregiver to stay with child, not dropped off.
Approximately 6:30-8:30 so that students can eat dinner beforehand. Must leave school by 9 for caretaking staff.
Register online (school cash online) to get an idea of numbers of people who will attend. Prepare a plan and possible date to

discuss at next meeting.

Proposed date: not February due to parent teacher interviews.

- Clothing drive School parents can donate extra/no longer needed items to the school to be distributed to Rockford students/families who need. Would we like to run something like this? Yes.

-Activity bags for indoor recess – Ms. Szeto was looking into vendor prices and options to be more cost effective, age-appropriate activities. Need one bag for every class. Is there a cost limit to what parent council can fund? - Adding a drain may help with the water collection in the back. The water needs to go somewhere. Leveling the area won't be enough of a solution.

- There are 3 outdoor recesses. If/when clothing gets wet, they shouldn't go outside again with wet clothing.

-Use of virtual technology (Google classroom, YouTube etc) is high in the classrooms. Many resources are used to teach the children throughout the day.

-March break – March 11-15th – there are no programs run through the school for that week.

-TDSB cold weather policy – students go outside if warmer than ~-26C with the windchill.
