Emergency Evacuations, Relocation & Attendance

In rare instances, there may be a situation that requires us to move to another location (usually a nearby school or safe building) in order for the school to still operate. This may be due to a prolonged power outage, loss of heat, etc. Should we need to relocate during the school day, students would be walked to the new location with school staff and supported by local emergency services personnel, and families would be notified via our new automated call system, through the local media and onsite postings of the location and pick-up and drop-off procedures. If a relocation is required before the school day begins, we would communicate this in the same manner. During any relocation, we ask parents/caregivers to be extra diligent when dropping off and picking up students and ensure that staff know and have recorded a student arriving or leaving. Parents/caregivers would not be permitted to remove a child **during** a move to another location. If you have questions about any safe procedures, please contact the school office.

Weather Guidelines

On all cold and/or wet days, we kindly ask parents to make sure their children are properly dressed for the weather and not to attend school before 8:45 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. (if they go home for lunch). Please check the forecast BEFORE sending children to school to ensure they are properly dressed for the day's weather. During the cold winter months, it may be necessary for students to remain inside or have a reduced recess time, particularly when the wind chill falls below -20 degrees Celsius (according to Environment Canada). Decisions such as these are made after consulting TDSB policy, neighbouring schools as well as local conditions. Information about students that require special consideration due to medical conditions should be shared with school staff along with a note from the child's physician.
