### **Indigenous Education and Sovereignty**

Indigenous Education is one of the pillars of the School Improvement Plan (SIP) at every TDSB school. We are committed to continuing our year-round learning and furthering our efforts in the pursuit of reconciliation.

This year, Ms. Oliver has coordinated our school-wide participation in a Walk for Wenjack.

The <u>Downie & Wenjack Fund (DWF)</u> was created out of two families coming together to make change, uphold Chanie Wenjack and Gord Downie's legacies, and create a pathway on the journey toward reconciliation. While many of us may know the famous Gord Downie, the story of Chanie Wenjack is just as important. Wenjack was an Anishinaabe boy who was forced to attend Cecilia Jeffrey Residential School in Kenora, Ontario. Three years later, determined to return to his family and culture, Wenjack escaped and attempted to walk over 600 kilometres to his home. Wenjack could not survive the harsh October temperatures in Northern Ontario.

Rolph Road wants to help Wenjack complete the rest of his walk back home. If you would like to watch a movie about Chanie Wenjack's life, you may view it <u>HERE</u>.



The TDSB's department of Speech-Language Pathology offers wonderful resources for families and educators that support language development.


