

May is Asian Heritage Month at the TDSB

Asian Heritage Month is recognized formally across Canada through an official declaration that was signed in May 2002. Subsequently, the Province of Ontario passed the <u>Asian Heritage Act</u> (2005), and the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) elected Trustees passed a motion to recognize Asian Heritage Month in April 2007.

We are proud to celebrate the numerous achievements of Asian-Canadians. Canada has been enriched by the vibrant traditions that we continue to recognize in our city by celebrating our heritage proudly through festivals and traditional events that continue to be celebrated through generations. This year our theme is *Joining Our Table: Celebrating Asian Canadians*.

The TDSB is the largest and one of the most diverse school boards in Canada. Nearly one-quarter of our students were born outside of Canada and collectively we speak more than 120 languages. According to the 2017 TDSB Student & Parent Census 40% of TDSB students self-identified as Asian. During the month of May we are honoured to share with you several opportunities and resources to learn about the traditions, customs, and significant individuals that this heritage brings. May is Jewish Heritage Month at the TDSB

Jewish Heritage Month continues to be recognized at the Toronto District School Board during the month of May. Subsequently, the <u>Canadian Jewish Heritage Act</u>, was passed in May 2018 and is also recognized by the Province of Ontario by the passing of the <u>Jewish Heritage Month Act</u>, 2012. As stated in the Jewish Heritage Month Act, 2012, "May is a significant month for the Jewish Canadian community. Israeli Independence Day (Yom ha-Atzmaut) and Holocaust Remembrance Day (Yom ha-Shoah) frequently occur in May, as do various Jewish artistic and cultural events."

This year marks the 90th anniversary of the Christie Pits riot that took place in Toronto in August 1933. To commemorate this moment in history, the TDSB's Jewish Heritage Committee in collaboration with the Italian Heritage Committee are offering TDSB students in Grades 8 and 10 a chance to learn about the largest race riot in Canadian history.


This is our most ambitious show yet, with the most students involved ever, and we're so proud of how they've all risen to the challenge and dived "under the sea!"
