

Road Safety at Rolph Road

Recently we have seen an increase in vehicles parking on the east side during pick up and drop off. This is PROHIBITED! We MUST do better and we need your help for the safety of our students.

Students are crossing the road and this inhibits their ability to see oncoming cars, causes the street to become highly congested and makes it difficult for cars to safely pass one another. We please ask that you obey these rules and help us keep our students safe! Please also ensure that you do not stop and/or park in the bus loading zone at any time.

Alternate parking can be found on Hanna, Southvale, Sutherland and Rolph (south of Southvale).

With the help of our Eco Club, we are currently planning for Canada Road Safety week in May. Cars will be asked to move along and those found idling will receive "tickets" from our Eco Club student leaders. More information to come.

More Safety Reminders

We continue to experience problems in the school parking lot and we ask that families please arrive a few minutes earlier and park on the street *if you are arriving after 8:15 am*, even if you are dropping off to Rolph Road Daycare. School staff, daycare staff, TDSB tradespeople and delivery vehicles must be able to park and enter the school to prepare for the school day, etc.,



We are proud to celebrate the numerous achievements of Asian-Canadians. Canada has been enriched by the vibrant traditions that we continue to recognize in our city by celebrating our heritage proudly through festivals and traditional events that continue to be celebrated through generations.

This year's theme for May 2024 was selected by the Asian Heritage Month Volunteer Planning Committee as Our Journeys: Thriving Through Struggle and Triumph.

May is Jewish Heritage Month at the TDSB

Jewish Heritage Month continues to be recognized at the Toronto District School Board during the month of May. Subsequently, the <u>Canadian Jewish Heritage Act</u>, was passed in May 2018 and is also recognized by the Province of Ontario by the passing of the <u>Jewish Heritage Month Act</u>, 2012. As stated in the Jewish Heritage Month Act, 2012, "May is a significant month for the Jewish Canadian community. Israeli Independence Day (Yom ha-Atzmaut) and Holocaust Remembrance Day (Yom ha-Shoah) frequently occur in May, as do various Jewish artistic and cultural events."

This year, the TDSB Jewish Heritage Committee is focussing on students in Kindergarten to Grade 3 using the book The Mouse Who Danced the Hora by Pamela Mayer, illustrated by Christine Davenier, to teach our youngest students about diversity and equity through Jewish wedding traditions, and learning to dance the Hora.

Paint Night with CCSA promises to be a blast! Registration has been extended and will close Tuesday April 30th.


