We remind all parents/guardians/caregivers to always hold your child's hand anytime you are in the school parking lot. Please <u>DO NOT</u> let your children walk or run across the parking lot unescorted. <u>The path next to the iron fence is the best route to walk along</u>.

This reminder is being shared because we have had two reports this week of a driver having to stop suddenly because a child was walking through the parking lot, unaware of the nearby moving vehicle. Our Rolph Road team is counting on parents/guardians/caregivers to reinforce this message to children.

As always, the safety of our students is a priority and we urge you to once again, reinforce with your children common street proofing and safety procedures.
