

Attention Rolph Road Cross Country Team

October 4 - North Conference Cross Country Meet at Earl Bales Park

Our team is over 120 students from grades 1 - 6...that's more than a third of our school!!!

Reminder: The team is meeting at Earl Bales at 9:30 a.m. on October 4...The meet starts at 10:00 am! Look for our Rolph Road banner and fellow Rolph Road cross-country runners when you get there! That will be our meeting spot for the day. When you arrive at the meet, please see Mr. Williams, as he will be waiting there to write each student's race number on their hand. Please note that Mr. Jonsohn will be at the starting line. Parents will be responsible for supervising their children at the meeting spot and for ensuring they arrive at the starting line to meet Mr. Jonsohn on time for their race.

Your child has already received a Rolph Road t-shirt or a pinny to borrow and is asked to please wear that shirt the day of the race. We kindly ask that the t-shirt/pinny is taken home and washed and returned to coaches after the meet. Students should also dress in anticipation of variable weather conditions on race day. They should dress in layers, and bring a second pair of shoes, dry socks and a raincoat or rainproof windbreaker type jacket. We recommend that runners have a high carbohydrate dinner the night before the race and an early breakfast to avoid cramping and stomach issues. It's going to be an incredible day! Your coaches are very proud of how hard and dedicated our Rolph Road athletes are!!!
