Respecting our School and Surrounding Spaces

Incidents of vandalism on school property have been reported to TDSB Security Services this week. Items have apparently been thrown at school windows after hours and have also been thrown onto one of the storage containers in the yard. A window cover was damaged and has since been repaired.

Thank you to our caretakers who have been cleaning up garbage and various items including bottles of alcohol that have been thrown around in the school yard.

How can you help after school hours and/or on weekends if you witness unsafe or possible criminal activity on school property?

- Contact the TDSB Emergency Call Centre at 416-395-4620 to report concerns about activities on school property after hours or on the weekend.
- Encourage visitors to always discard litter in the appropriate recycling or garbage bins.
- Please also remember that there are no pets permitted in the schoolyard and especially
 on the field that is used daily for various sports tryouts, team practises and gym classes.
 Unfortunately, we have had instances when children have stepped or slipped on dog
 waste and soiled their clothing.

Our Facility Team Leader continues to provide ongoing support with various updates and improvements at our school. As mentioned above, I reported damage to a window cover that occurred after school hours and it has since quickly been repaired.

The Groundskeeping crew returned this week. Both the south and the north climber areas were topped up with fiber weave mulch. The very popular sandbox in our Kindergarten Yard was filled which was very exciting for students. Fiber weave mulch was also added in our Kindergarten Yard which helps to minimize the dust and dirt blowing around on dry days.


