Safety Reminders – Please review with your child(ren)

Thank you to all families who are walking to Door 2 (near the parking lot) <u>on the path next to the iron fence</u>. Our Rolph Road team is counting on parents/guardians/caregivers to reinforce to children that we do not advise walking in the school parking lot. We again ask for your cooperation by ensuring that you <u>do not enter the school parking lot after 8:00 am, even if you are dropping off to daycare</u>. School staff, daycare staff, TDSB tradespeople and delivery vehicles must be able to park and enter the school to prepare for the school day, attend meetings, etc.,

As always, the safety of our students is a priority and we urge you to once again, reinforce with your children common street proofing and safety procedures. Two TDSB Safety Tip sheets are linked for you below and this is a good time to review them as the warmer weather is here to stay.

- Encourage visitors to always discard litter in the appropriate recycling or garbage bins.
- Please also remember that there are no pets permitted in the schoolyard and especially on the field used daily for various sports tryouts, team practises and gym classes.
 Unfortunately, we have had instances when children have stepped or slipped on dog waste and dirtied their clothing.

News from our Rolph Road Library Learning Commons


Our Rolph Road Library Learning Commons (LLC) continues to be a busy hub of learning, achieving, engagement and belonging. We are all very excited about the start of our library renovation/revitalization project which is expected to begin as early as April 2025!

YANA Club (You Are Not Alone), continues to have a good number of students coming every Monday during afternoon recess. It is offering a safe space for our Grades 3-6 students to engage in friendship and social-emotional learning sessions. The YANA Club provides invaluable support and resources in mental health and belonging through games, activities, and sharing sessions.

In our Innovation Lab with Ms. Massos, the Grade 2 and 3's were able to program/create their own digital thermometers for a STEAM inquiry! The students used coding language and a program called MakeCode to code the micro:bits to be able to sense the temperature inside versus outside the learning classroom. Micro:bits are small computers that you can code and they can do some really cool things! The students really enjoy learning and using the micro:bits.

Once again, the Grade 4 /5 students in Room 23 partnered with Ms. Massos to collaborate on a mixed media arts piece connected to mental health and well-being. Ms. Macapagal had students listen to songs from different places and decades around the world, all had themes of mental health and wellness. The students then worked in partnership in the LLC to create art pieces, using mixed media, to express how the song resonated with them.
