Progress Reports will be sent Electronically on November 12th

All Progress Reports will be sent home electronically on Tuesday November 12th. Families will receive an email from School Messenger sometime on Tuesday afternoon with a link to your child(ren)'s report card(s). The Progress Report is intended to provide you with an early indication of how your child is progressing at this point in the school year.

A large focus for the Progress Report for Grades 1-8 is the Learning Skills: Responsibility, Organization, Collaboration, Initiative, Independent Work and Self-Regulation. The development of these learning skills is an integral part of a student's learning. The Kindergarten Communication of Learning Report provides initial observations and information about your child's strengths and growth. Suggestions for the next steps your child is ready to take in their learning are also included.

Teachers have already been reaching out to families to schedule parent-teacher conferences. In-person meetings, virtual meetings, or phone calls will be scheduled during the week of November 11-15. This meeting is an opportunity to hear more about the day-to-day rich learning experiences in our classrooms, and the goals students are working to achieve. News from our Library Learning Commons (LLC)


Our Library Learning Commons is a bustling and fun place. Grade 5 Students from Room 23 are partnering with Ms. Massos in the Innovation Lab to create 3D working models for their Human Organ systems unit. The students were challenged to use recyclable materials to build and construct their 3D models. Using the STEAM Engineering Design Process, students planned, built, and tested their 3D models. The grade 5's researched their organ systems and created a Pixton comic to explain their research in an engaging and friendly manner. We are still working on the final products and hoping to have them up for display in the LLC in the coming weeks.

The TDSB's department of Speech-Language Pathology offers wonderful resources for families and educators that support language development.


