T.D.S.B. SEVERE WEATHER PROCEDURES

Children need an opportunity to get exercise, breathe fresh air, and enjoy free-play time outdoors. However, weather conditions sometimes warrant that <u>indoor</u> recesses and lunch periods take place. The following is the T.D.S.B. policy regarding extreme/inclement weather:

Conditions warranting indoor lunch/recess:

Heavy rain, thunderstorms, lightning, hail, ice, extreme winds and extreme cold. Cold weather:

When temperature and/or windchill factor indicates ~28C or lower, children will remain indoors due to risk of frostnip and frostbite. When temperature and/or windchill factor indicates ~20 to ~28C, lunch recesses may be shortened to 20 minutes depending on local conditions.

Humidity, Heat and Smog Alerts:

The City of Toronto issues heat alerts and heat emergencies based on the daily forecast from May to September.

<u>Other conditions</u>: Weather conditions change during the day. When necessary, and if the weather is questionable, the school principal will consult the <u>Weather Network website</u> to determine the exact local weather conditions for Rouge Valley P.S.

We remind students that they need to dress for the weather since we will be going outside unless the above-noted thresholds are met.

<u>During extreme weather conditions, students should arrive to school just before our entry times of 8:40 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Unfortunately, caregivers are not able to wait inside for the dismissal of students. Thank you for your amazing support!</u>

IMPORTANT REMINDERS to keep all students and staff safe:

- Daily health screening to be completed for each student at home, before entry into the school
- PLEASE, please do not send students to school who are sick or display any symptoms of COVID, flu, or cold, (e.g., headache, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea)



- ♦ Rouge Valley will continue to be a MASK FRIENDLY environment
- Please remind your child(ren) of the importance of good hand hygiene. Practice at home!
- STUDENTS need to be ON TIME to enter the school at the bell
