KEEPING OUR KIDS SAFE

At school, the safety of your child is our most important priority. We remind you to keep school staff up to date with your address, email, phone number, childcare arrangements, to whom your child may be released. We also encourage you not to permit your child to make alternate arrangements over the lunch hour if they are in our lunch program. We need you to let us know about any changes of routine and to communicate with the office if they are leaving early for any reason. The <u>Toronto Police streetproofing program</u> encourages you to teach your child:

- his/her name, address, phone number and how to Dial 9-1-1 in an emergency
- to communicate with you when they feel unsafe or afraid and to keep you informed as to their whereabouts at all times
- never to admit to being alone in the home when answering the telephone and never to invite strangers into the house or answer the door when alone
- never to approach or enter a stranger's car or hitchhike and never to travel or play alone- always be with friends
- to trust their feelings and say "NO" to an adult if that adult wants them to do something that they feel is wrong
- not to accept gifts from strangers and to tell you if someone has asked them to keep a secret from you
- that no one has the right to touch any part of their body that a bathing suit would cover
- that if they are being followed, or approached too closely, to run home or go to the nearest public place and ask for help and report to
- your school authorities or a police officer, anyone who act suspiciously towards them
- never to play in deserted buildings or isolated areas and to avoid taking shortcuts through parks and fields
- never to enter anyone's home without your permission
- never to show their money or valuables and, if approached, to give it up rather than risk injury
- to be aware of surroundings and not be distracted; never text and walk or wear headphones or earbuds to play loud music
- that a police officer is a friend who can always be relied upon when they are lost or need assistance.

Another option is dropping off /picking up at the path on Durness or Carlisle Cres., or Tall Pines Community Centre lot.

PLEASE DO NOT use the staff parking lot to drop off/pick up students.



The bus loop is a designated fire route. You MAY drop off your child(ren) along the bus loop but PLEASE DO NOT park in the bus loop– keep the traffic moving!

Whenever possible, and to decrease the congestion in front of our school, we encourage all of our students to WALK TO SCHOOL. It is a great way for children to receive daily exercise, reduces pollution and other environmental impacts, and most of all, promotes a healthy, active lifestyle!
