IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

Please ensure that students arrive at school with the food (lunches) that they will need for the day. Please provide a "Boomerang" lunch for your child. This means that ALL items, packaging, unfinished food/drinks will be sent home at the end of each day. As always, we encourage healthy, nutritious foods as well as the use of reusable food and liquid containers to support our Eco-schools and Healthy Eating initiatives. Students will need to bring an individual, reusable water bottle(s) from home for use through the day. We have students with nut and peanut allergies– please do not send anything containing these products to school



In the case of rain or other extreme/inclement weather, we ask that students not be dropped off or arrive at the school until just before the entry bell at 8:40 a.m. Regardless of weather, students who go home for lunch are asked not to return until just before the entry bell at 12:30 p.m. Thank you for your cooperation!



Parents, we need your help! We want to ensure the safety of all of our students. Parking IS PERMITTED along Durnford Rd. in front of the school. Another option is dropping off /picking up at the path on Durness or Carlisle Cres., or Tall Pines Community Centre lot PLEASE DO NOT use the staff parking lot to drop off/pick up students.



The bus loop is a designated fire route. You MAY drop off your child(ren) along the bus loop but PLEASE DO NOT park in the bus loop – keep the traffic moving!

Whenever possible, and to decrease the congestion in front of our school, we encourage all of our students to WALK TO SCHOOL. It is a great way for children to receive daily exercise , reduces pollution and other environmental impacts, and most of all, promotes a healthy, active lifestyle!

REORGANIZATION/REBALANCING of CLASSES

Every effort has been made to ensure that your child experiences success this year. On occasion, due to circumstances and/or changes in enrolment, schools/classrooms may need to be re-organized and students might need to change classrooms/teachers. Any possible reorganization usually occurs at the end of September based on the actual number of students in attendance, in accordance with Board and Ministry mandated class size caps and targets. If this becomes necessary, and your child will be affected by a change, we will inform you as soon as possible.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS to keep all students and staff safe:

- Daily health screening to be completed for each student at home, before entry into the school
- PLEASE, please do not send students to school who are sick or display any symptoms of COVID, flu, or cold, GI issues (e.g., headache, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea)
- Rouge Valley will continue to be a MASK FRIENDLY environment
- + Please remind your child(ren) of the importance of good hand hygiene. Practice at home
- STUDENTS need to be ON TIME to enter the school at the bell THANK YOU FOR HELPING US TO KEEP EVERYONE SAFE!

PARENT CONCERN PROTOCOL:

The Toronto District School Board has established a procedure for addressing parental concerns. The Parent Concern Protocol is based on the best practices currently used in TDSB schools for addressing parents' concerns, and provides a range of feasible options for principals and superintendents of education when parents bring individual concerns to them.

At Rouge Valley, parent concerns have always received a high priority and this procedure supports that priority.

Parents are always encouraged and will be directed to discuss any concerns <u>FIRST with their</u> <u>child's teacher (if the concern relates to the student or the classroom)</u>. Discuss the concern directly with the Principal when the concern is about the school as a whole, or its policies.

BUILD CHARACTER BUILD SUCCESS

At Rouge Valley, we continue to develop character in all students and this is a shared responsibility between home and school. There is a need for family, community and schools to engage cooperatively to encourage students' learning and maturing as social beings.
