Please be aware that the school parking lot is for staff only. There is lots of space in the cul-de-sac for families to park when dropping off and picking up children from school.



## **Food and Celebrations**

The Roywood Public School community celebrates the birthdays of students by announcing their birthday over the announcements. We also encourage family to donate a book to the classroom to honour their child's birthday and the teacher will read it to the class, or family can prepare a gift bag (e.g., stickers, pencils, erasers) to be given to each child in the class that can be handed out at the end of the day. We ask that food items such as birthday cake, pizza and chips not be sent to school as many children have allergies and/or food restrictions. Food that is sent to school with students for this purpose will be returned unopened. Many children have allergies to particular food products. Some children are severely

allergic to peanut products (e.g. peanut butter). Even a small amount of exposure through touch or air can be fatal within minutes. Nuts, eggs, soy, fish, shellfish, wheat, milk, sesame seeds and sulphites are also known to cause severe reactions for some students and staff. In addition, many families like to

the diet of their children.

If you have not yet completed the important beginning of the year forms, please do so ASAP. Thank you for your cooperation!



#### COURSE NOW OFFERED IN PERSON

October 6th, PA Day (8:30am to 3:30pm) For youth in grades 5, 6, 7 and 8

Caregiver and first aid skills for youth in grades 5 to 8.

Participants learn how to manage difficult behaviour, recognize and prevent unsafe situations, how to care for babies and children, and leadership skills. Babysitting promises to deepen and enhance the responsibility that older youth feel when caring for younger children.

The curriculum includes new science for giving appropriate care in an emergency.
