- We'll meet all runners at 8:40 sharp in the senior gym on October 4th




School Photo Day

Morning Drop Off & Afternoon Pick Up Update:

Parents of students in Grades 1 - 5 are asked to please remain at or behind the gate when dropping children off at 8:40. This greatly assists supervision staff in ensuring a safe and welcoming environment for students. The fitness structure will be closed between 3:15-3:30 pm daily. Thank you in advance for everyone's support. We look forward to greeting all of our students punctually each day:)

Cell Phones/Mobile Devices at School

We ask that cell phones remain at home and should they be brought to school with parent permission they must be secured and locked in lockers for the duration of the instructional day without exception. Cell phones are not permitted in the classroom- or learning spaces for safety and to minimise distractions to learning and teaching time inclusive of recess and supervised lunch time.

Safe Arrival Program

When the Safe Arrival option is selected the call will be transferred directly to the School Messenger phone system. (Parents/Guardians can still call the 1-833-250-2290 directly and receive the same options.)

Calling from a phone number registered in PowerSchool

- Parent/Guardian calls main school number and listens to the welcome message
- To report a student absence, press 1 (can be 2 or 3 depending on your specific school) (caller hears "Wait while I transfer your call")
- Then "Welcome to School Messenger notification system for Toronto District School Board"
- For student attendance, press 3
 - o For student A in grade..., press 2
 - o For student B in grade..., press 3
 - o For student C in grade..., press 4

Calling from a phone number not registered in PowerSchool

- Parent calls main school number and listens to the welcome message
- To report a student absence, press 1 (can be 2 or 3 depending on your specific school) (caller hears "Wait while I transfer your call")
- "Welcome to School Messenger notification system for Toronto District School Board"
- For student attendance, press 3
 - o Please enter a phone number that you have registered with a school
 - o If phone number is registered then parents/guardians will be able to pick the student and report the absence

If your phone number is not registered you will receive the message "This phone number does not have any children registered to it". Parents/guardians will need to call the school and update data in the Student Information System.

If your child is going to be late please have them come to the main office doors (door #1) and ring the bell. If you need to pick up your child early unexpectedly please call the office ahead of time and come to the main office door (door#1) and ring the bell we will try to have your child ready at the office for your arrival.

Should you need to pick up your child early for an appointment please email your child's teacher as well as Rebecca.Carambelas@tdsb.on.ca to let them know the reason, date and time of pick up.
