Osslt Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test

<u>All</u> Grade 10 students write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test in the spring of their Grade 10 year.

If a student is successful, they fulfill the literacy requirement for graduation.

If a student is unsuccessful, they can rewrite the OSSLT or enrol in the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OLC4O) in Grade 12.
