Toronto, November 20, 2020 - The Ontario Black History Society (OBHS), an organization dedicated to the recognition and celebration of Black history, hosts our annual High School Conference virtually on November 27, 2020.

COVID-19 is having a detrimental effect on the Black community. This virtual conference aims to simplify the process for high school students to transition to post-secondary education. Funded by Cadillac Fairview and Toronto Foundation, the event will provide students and their parents/ guardians, with an inside look at post-secondary institutions and the application process.

This event launches a toolkit built around a survey of parents and grade 12 students and creates a virtual experience replete with digital resources, supplemental webinars and videos to assist Black Youth in navigating post-secondary education decisions during this pandemic.

Hosted by Femi Lawson, a rising international phenomenon and talent. With his roots lying in the luscious lands of Nigeria, and a partial home base in the diverse metropolitan city of Toronto, Femi is a mosaic blend of cultures, and as such his work around the globe as a cultural curator is defined by his unrelenting goal to unite people.
