### How to understand the 6 day timetable:

- The School on a 6 day rotation schedule, so students can learn up to two courses per day. One in the morning at school, the second at home in the afternoon.
- There are four pieces how a class period is created. 1) Course Name 2) Class Number 3) Cohort and 4) Classroom Number or AT HOME  
e.g. 1) Course Name: ENG1D1, 2) Class Number: 1 or 2 or 3, 3) Cohort: A or B or A/B and 4) Classroom Number or AT HOME.
- Classes of 30 Students would be divided into 2 cohorts of 15 each (e.g. 1A, 1B or 2A, 2B or 3A, 3B).
- Essentially, you stay in the same classroom all morning learning one subject for 4 ½ hours (one cohort of one class).
- Each day in the afternoon, there is a synchronous (online) learning opportunity (1 ½ hours) for one subject class (entire class of both cohorts A & B) via Google Meet.
- When everything put to gather the course timetabled looks similar to in the Morning: ENG1D1-1A Rm 123 or in the Afternoon: ENG1D1-1A/1B AT HOME

- On the school days that a subject class of students is not in, the teacher would assign work for those students to complete at home. The Google classroom or Brightspace platform would reinforce and remind students of this work.
