- New OA and budget secretary
- New head daytime janitor

- many newcomer students coming to SCI (approx 20), mainly from Syria and Turkey and speak arabic. They take ESL, Learning skills and Canadian Geography, phys-ed. Another 20 students are coming before the end of the year. They are bussed in/out from about 9:15-2
- The student census happens every 5 years. Parents have been notified about the census, parents can opt out for their children. Hoping to have students complete the survey May 4th during P1
- guidance
  - uni/college offers should be coming out soon
  - full disclosure date: if your child is a senior student, and is taking 4 courses and would like to drop 1 course, the deadline is April 26
  - $\circ~$  course changes should all be made now, will be more difficult later
  - $\circ$  summer school registration is open now for in person or remote
  - summer school credit recovery is only remote, for students who want to upgrade poor/failed courses
- having more success with coverages, so field trips, etc, can run
- had an Iftar ceremony last week with 200 people, was planned by the Muslim Student Alliance
- Caring Safe and Accepting Schools next meeting Wednesday May 3rd @ 3:30, everyone welcome
- celebrating different heritages each month (last month was Greek, this month is Sheikh and Hispanic/Latin America)
- report cards coming out this week
- June 14 moratorium (no tests or assessments)
- culminating activities can begin May 9, teachers are trying to spread out workload over the courses
- OSSLT first 2 sittings of literacy test were April 18
- ventilation system is being replaced this summer, walls will be knocked out, building will be closed to permits
- Camp Manitou is happening next year. The price has increased significantly (almost doubled), from Sept 17-20. Student leader hopefuls are working on training now and will be notified soon if they are successful. Camp is offered to all grade 10 students
- EQAO June 12 & 13 for grade 9 students, there are 2 booklets and they do 1 each day, on a computer. Each booklet is 75 minutes long.

- staffing/scheduling is happening now, will be hiring 1 teacher
- hoping to have schedules out in June and to resolve any conflicts before the summer
- theatre show happening spring theatre night
- student fees will be increasing next year, introducing an athletic fee. This is because there is NO money coming from the ministry for any extra-curricular or sport activities
