Literacy Week at Sir Adam Beck

This year the Toronto District School Board has identified the importance of building joy, engagement and belonging in schools as a foundation for academic achievement and student success as one of the most important system priorities. This is something that, we at Sir Adam Beck, have embraced and have worked tirelessly toward.

One of our school goals has been implementing evidence based literacy practices into our daily programs while centering student voice, identity and lived experiences. Teachers have been actively engaged in professional development opportunities exploring phonological and phonemic awareness skills into their programs thereby helping students build their reading toolbox of strategies. Some of our teachers have even had the opportunity to attend Learning Network sessions to further strengthen and build a network of support amongst neighbouring schools.

During the week of January 23rd to the 27th, we celebrated Literacy Week at Sir Adam Beck. Students and staff had the opportunity to share their favourite books, listen to different teachers read and continue to build upon the joy and love of reading. On Thursday January 26th, we were very fortunate to welcome author Yolanda T. Marshall who came to speak and share her books: C is for Carnaval, My Soca Birthday Party and Hot Cross Buns for Everyone with students. During these sessions she was able to share her lived experiences and cultural identity with students and staff. Our Literacy Week celebration culminated on Friday January 27th with our Family Literacy Day when we welcomed Parents and Caregivers into classrooms to share their favourite books and stories.

As partners, we acknowledge the important role that Parents and Caregivers play in creating a strong bond between home and school and are grateful to everyone who was able to participate in our celebration. We would also like to thank our School Council for their continued support of such initiatives and for helping us build a foundational love of reading in all students.

February is Black History Month! We are proud of TDSB's and SAB's commitments to antiracism and the initiatives focused on equity, diversity and inclusion that we have been able to support with the help of this community. Our collective action on racism is one of our greatest strengths.

Black History Month was established nearly one hundred years ago to bring Black history, Black stories and Black culture into the center of our Canadian experience – not just throughout February, but all year long. In 1995, the first Black Canadian woman to be elected to the federal government, Dr. Jean Augustine, introduced a motion that was passed unanimously by the House of Commons to recognize February as Black History Month across Canada. Since then, each February Canadians from coast to coast celebrate and learn about the storied history of Black Canadians. This year, we continue to shed light on the Black experience in Canada - both past and present.

Dental Screening 2022-2023 School Year

The Toronto Public Health Dental Department is required by the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care to screen children in elementary schools. The results of the screening will be used to appropriately refer students requiring dental care. As a follow up to the screening, only parents whose children were screened will be notified and a note to that effect will be sent home with their child/ren. Students who do not have dental insurance and who cannot afford to pay for dental care may be eligible for services offered by Toronto Public Health.

The students in the following grades will be screened in this school year: JK, SK and Grade 2

A Parent Letter will be distributed via print out and email to the aforementioned grades prior to the commencement of screening. If a parent outside of these grades wishes to have their child(ren) screened, please contact the office directly and we will make arrangements to provide screening.

Sir Adam Beck's Eco-School Waste Audit #1 Food for Thought

Which waste source (garbage, recycling, or the green bin) resulted in the most waste? The recycling bin resulted in the most waste at 1.2kg.

Which waste category represented the largest percentage of your waste for each waste source?



Garbage: Food waste & soiled paper at 33%

Recycle: Recyclable papers at 73%

Green bin: Food waste and paper towels at 99%

How much waste does each student at Sir Adam Beck create annually?

According to these results, 1.5kg a year!

Were you surprised by the results?

Eco Rep #1-We did okay, there was some stuff that wasn't sorted properly.

Eco Rep #2-I think we did mostly good, our recycling was good.

Eco Rep #3-Pretty good and also kind of bad. because recycling was pretty good and garbage was not so good.

Eco Rep #4-Not bad, the green bin was 99% and the garbage was not really good because of the orange peels.

How much waste did you help to divert?

Based on these results, we will divert 66% of waste this school year!

Did you find any reusable items?

Yes, we found a marker. We have a *Do the Write Thing* recycling container by the main office.

How much waste in your garbage was actually garbage?

Only 62.5% of our waste was actually garbage!

Are most of your recyclables and organics getting sorted into the correct bins?

Almost! Most of our recyclables are getting recycled into the correct bins. We did find a few items that should have been in the garbage, like a yogurt container that wasn't rinsed, some pieces of laminate and paper with paint on it. Our green bin was filled with 99% food waste and soiled paper, however several orange peels ended up in the garbage which heavily affected the weight.

How can you promote proper waste sorting at your school?



According to EcoSchool Club members, SAB can do the following to promote proper waste sorting:

- Litterless lunches, have Waste Wizards on hand in the lunchroom during pizza lunches
- Reusable water bottles in the classroom
- Announcements about proper sorting
- Label bins and put posters up around the school, display on bulletin boards
- EcoClub members will show audience how to sort waste properly at assembly
- Recycling Bin Monitors are trained on proper waste sorting and handed out weekly We RecycleOOPS tags
- Visit classrooms to review proper sorting

How can you reduce waste at your school?

Our EcoClub members said SAB can reduce waste at our school by sending a note home in student lunch bags about Litterless lunches. There will be more green bins available for food waste, at lunch and at recess and waste wizard to help sort waste on Fridays. We host an annual clothing drive in the Spring to minimise

Hello from the Library, SAB Families!

The Forest of Reading Program is well underway and we have 40 students in Grades 3-5 who are eagerly reading books in four different series. They are enjoying visiting each book expert and receiving a signature on their passport for each book they complete. This program will continue until April when students will have an opportunity to vote for their favourite book.

Students in Kindergarten to Grade 2 are also participating in this program by listening to read alouds during their scheduled library times. These students will also be voting for their favourite book out of the ten they hear in class.

Overdue Library Books and Lost Books:

Library books have a loan of three weeks. Students have library once per week and are encouraged to return their books during their scheduled library period to avoid their books becoming overdue. Please note:

- 1. There are no longer overdue fines from the library, however if a book has not been returned 30 days past its due date the book becomes marked as "lost" in the TPL system. Parents of the card holder will receive a letter or email letting you know the cost of the book. If the book is returned, the fee is then removed from the account.
- 2. When students have more than 10 overdue books, their account is blocked, which means they are not able to take out any more books until the ones they have are returned.

Many students, especially those in Grades 3-5, are also taking out books after school when they visit the library on their own time, which is amazing! Please help ensure they don't run into either of the two problems above by reminding them to be responsible for returning their books on time. If you do happen to receive an email or letter noting there have been charges on their library account, please ask your child to check their locker/desk/bedroom/backpack to locate the book and return it to the library. Once located, please send me an email (sarah.harwood@tdsb.on.ca) to let me know the book is on its way back so I can have TPL staff update the account.

Lastly, if you are signing out books for your own use, please use your personal library card. If you don't have one, the library will give you one for free. It's easy to set up and will prevent issues like blocked accounts from arising.
