Principal's Message:

Thank you to the entire school community for the overwhelming response to our coat drive. Over 35 large donation bags filling two SUVs were collected to support Lifeline Afghanistan and the refugees arriving to live in Toronto.

The Elementary Switch Form choice of Virtual or In-Person for the next term/semester due date is approaching. Parents/caregivers and students who do not wish to make a change do not need to complete the form. A link to the Elementary Switch Form was sent to parents/caregivers on **Friday**, **December 3**. Families interested in making a switch have until January 7, 2022 to respond.

The cold weather is already upon us and so is the likelihood of severe weather. The Board's Severe Weather Procedure has been reviewed and guided by the necessary health and safety conditions as a result of the pandemic, the need to maintain cohorts and not being able to combine classes, which is often necessary on days with bad weather because of reduced staffing levels. As a result, this year, the TDSB has determined that when buses are cancelled, all schools -- including both in-person and virtual learning -- will also be closed to staff and students.

The initial offers of placement for Early French Immersion at SAB have been sent out to parents/caregivers. Families in this wave of offers had until December 16, 2021 to accept the placement online. Subsequent offers will continue into the new year until the placement process is complete. Due to the volume of applications, it can take many weeks for all the families to hear. Families are encouraged to check their email frequently, including junk mail.

For families interested in the TDSB's system-wide Middle French Immersion Program (begins in Grade 4), there is an online process to apply. To apply for the Middle French Immersion Program (Grade 4 entry) for September 2022, applications must be completed online between <u>January 3</u> and January 28, 2022. Please see p. 6 for additional details.

Despite the uncertainty of the pandemic, planning for our centennial celebrations will continue in the new year. Students will work on a mural and do activities to learn more about Sir Adam Beck, the person and the school. Other activities being explored are a virtual/in-person Council Family Dance night (Friday April 29th) and Open House (Sat April 30). SAB's December Visrtual Student Assembly

December's virtual assembly was held on Friday, December 17th. Mr. Trigianni's kindergarten students opened the assembly by sharing a song called *La neige tombe*. An upbeat song about snow falling and students catching snowflakes.

Mrs. Myhal's grade 1/2 class talked about TDSB's Character Trait for the month of December, Kindness. Students talked about how they can light up the world with kindness, by reading a personal pledge on how to make the world a kinder place. Students said they can light up the world by inviting their friends to play with them, by wearing their indoor shoes to help keep the school clean, by helping to keep their house clean and by picking up garbage in the neighbourhood to help the environment.



Mme Dibon-Smith's grade 5 class continued with a message of kindness. Each student participated in reading a book called La gentillesse/Kindness, in both English and French. Students shared examples of struggles they have experienced to highlight the importance of kindness because you don't always know what others are going through. A simple act of kindness can really brighten someone's day. Students then shared a kindness tree that displayed acts of kindness on leaves in the shape of a heart. Examples of kindness included messages such as saying hi to someone, holding the door open for someone, writing a letter to a friend or being kind to the Earth. The presentation ended with an act of kindness they participated in as a class. Students received a wishlist for children who are currently at Sick Kids Hospital and crossed off donations from the wishlist.

The Sick Kids COVID-19 Saliva Testing Program

The Hospital for Sick Children is pleased to provide the COVID-19 Saliva Testing Program in partnership with your school. Under this program, we offer COVID-19 saliva test kits for symptomatic staff, students, and household members, or those who have been identified by Toronto Public Health (TPH) as a high risk/close contact of a confirmed COVID-19 positive case. We also offer cohort and/or outbreak testing as recommended by TPH. Through participation in this program, we hope to provide a test that is painless and accessible, reduce COVID-19 cases in your school, keep schools open, promote healthy childhood development, and support the health and safety of your community.

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Where do I pick up my kit?	 Saliva kits will be provided to your school administration if testing criteria is met: 1. Have symptoms consistent with COVID-19 2. High risk/close contact identified by TPH 3. Cohort/outbreak management identified by TPH You can bring a kit home from school OR a non-symptomatic member of the household can pick one up
What is in my saliva kit?	 Saliva collection container (the blue liquid deactivates the virus) Laboratory form (must be filled out to receive your results) Saliva collection instructions (on the back of the laboratory form) Instructions for how to access your results A blank label for your saliva container (label with legal full name and date of birth as per your health card and stick onto the specimen container)
When to use a kit?	 The individual is experiencing at least 1 or more COVID-19 symptom The individual has been informed by TPH that they are a high risk/close contact to a COVID-19 positive case Cohort/outbreak testing Please follow the testing window dates provided by TPH in the close contact letter and include the outbreak number on the lab requisition. If you have symptoms, test right away. Otherwise, wait until the recommended DATE from TPH.
How to collect saliva?	 If you fit testing criteria, pick up a COVID-19 saliva kit Collect and label your sample, fill out the requisition, seal it in the biohazard bag, and drop off at the designated school location Only samples with a fully completed label and lab form will be processed. If you have a health card, the information must match the lab form. Include the outbreak number if provided. Saliva collection instructions: No eating, drinking, smoking, chewing gum, brushing teeth, vaping 30 minutes before your test. Click here: Saliva Collection Instructions
How to drop off the kit?	 At your school, there will be a pre-designated drop off location, open Monday-Friday during school hours For same day pickup, please have your samples dropped off by 9am or samples may be picked up the next day. Please place your sealed saliva kit (containing your labelled saliva container and the completed lab requisition) inside the brown paper bag.
When do I get my results?	 If the sample is positive, <u>you will</u> receive a telephone call from SickKids within 24- 48hours and Toronto Public Health to follow up on your result. If the result is negative, <u>you will not</u> receive a call. With OHIP - <u>Access your results</u> Without OHIP - Please write your email on the requisition form for follow up
