The Toronto District School Board continues to identify the importance of building joy, engagement and belonging in schools as a foundation for academic achievement and student success. This is something that, we at Sir Adam Beck, continue to embrace and have worked tirelessly toward.

One of our school goals continues to be the implementation of evidence-based literacy practices into our daily programs while centering student voice, identity and lived experiences. Teachers have actively engaged in professional development opportunities exploring phonological and phonemic awareness skills thereby helping students build their reading toolbox of strategies.

During the week of January 22nd, we celebrated Literacy Week at Sir Adam Beck. Students and staff had the opportunity to share their favourite books, listen to different teachers read and continue to build upon the joy and love of reading. We kicked the week off with a bilingual interactive performance of Beauty and the Beast performed by the Dufflebag Theatre group. Our Literacy Week celebration culminated on Friday January 27th with our Family Literacy Day when we welcomed Parents and Caregivers into classrooms to share their favourite books and stories.

As partners, we acknowledge the important role that Parents and Caregivers play in creating a strong bond between home and school and are grateful to everyone who was able to participate in our celebration. We would also like to thank our School Council for their continued support of such initiatives and for helping us build a foundational love of reading in all students.



February in the Library

Hello SAB Families!

In February, we celebrate African Heritage Month and Chinese Heritage Month. Our read alouds will reflect these heritage months as well as the character trait of fairness. With each read aloud, we focus on specific reading strategies and various aspects of the text.



The Forest of Reading Program is well underway and we have 50 students in Grades 3-5 who are eagerly reading books from three different series. Every day 3, 4, and 5 the library is open at lunch for the Forest of Reading club students to come to read and exchange their books. Once they have finished reading a Forest of Reading book, they will visit a book expert (thank you to the many staff members in the school who have pre-read the books and are ready to have book talk with students). Students will then receive a signature in their passport for each book they complete. This program will continue until April when students will have an opportunity to vote for their favourite book.

While the entire school is reading the Forest of Reading picture book series (Blue during library time, students in Kindergarten to Grade 2 will also be voting for their book out of the ten they hear in class. French Immersion Kindergarten to Grade 2 will also have the opportunity to hear French Forest of Reading picture books (Prix in their homeroom classes and will be able to vote on their favourite French book as well.

Health, Physical Education and Dance News

The HPED program continues to be busy with the students engaging in a variety of activities.

The Grade 1 and 2 classes just wrapped up a unit around healthy eating where they learned about building a healthy and balanced diet using the recommendations from the Canada's Food Guide. Students learned that a healthy diet consists of items from the fruits, vegetables, protein and whole grains as well as the importance of drinking water for hydration. The classes are now starting with Ball Hockey in the active part of the program.

Grade 3/4 classes reviewed the importance of eating a balanced diet using Canada's Food Guide but further explored the importance of understanding where our food comes from and how it is healthier to consume whole, natural foods as opposed to processed foods. Students are now aware to check labels to understand what is going into their body. The grade 4 students are also learning about the different types of bullying and how to recognize bullying and how to seek help.

The grade 4/5 class has just wrapped up a Basketball unit and are now learning about how to use the elements of Dance to communicate feelings and ideas in short, group dance pieces.

National Sweater Day/ Journée nationale du chandail – February 4th, 2024

We will be recognizing National Sweater Day on Friday February 9, the final day of our SAB Carnaval week.. National Sweater Day is an opportunity to raise awareness about climate change and energy conservation, and show how together – classroom by classroom, school by school, home by home, – we can be a part of the solution.

Heating accounts for 80% of residential energy use in Canada. If all Canadians lowered their thermostats by just 2 degrees Celsius this winter, it would reduce greenhouse gas emissions by about 4 megatons – that's equivalent to taking nearly 700,000 cars off the road! Ceremonies to honour the gods and ancestors are conducted at the end and beginning of each year. Events centre on the family, festive meals, lighting of lanterns and displays of fireworks. Grandparents and parents offer lucky money to their descendants as a form of good fortune.

Sir Adam Beck's Waste Audit Food for Thought

Which waste source (garbage, recycling, or the green bin) resulted in the most waste? The recycling bin resulted in the most waste at 1.8kg.

Which waste category represented the largest percentage of your waste for each waste source?

Garbage: All garbage items at 83% Recycle: Recyclable papers at 93%

Green bin: Food waste and paper towels at 99%

How much waste does each student at Sir Adam Beck create annually?

According to these results, 1.5kg a year!



Evelyn-I was a little surprised by how much paper towel we found in the recycling bin.

Claire-I'm surprised that we got 99% correct in our green bin.

Morvarid-I was surprised by the coffee cups in the garbage.

Alice-I was surprised by the wrappers in the recycling bin, they weren't in the right place.

How much waste did you help to divert?

Based on these results, we will divert 64% of waste this school year!

Did you find any reusable items?

No, we did not! Keep using our recycling bins in front of the office for batteries, writing utensils, ink and glasses.

How much waste in your garbage was actually garbage?

83% of our waste was actually garbage!

Are most of your recyclables and organics getting sorted into the correct bins?

Almost! Most of our recyclables are getting recycled into the correct bins. We did find a few items that should have been in the garbage, like a yogurt container that wasn't rinsed. Our green bin was filled with 99% food waste and soiled paper. However, some paper towels were found in garbage bins and recycling bins.

How can you promote proper waste sorting at your school?

According to EcoSchool Club members, SAB can do the following to promote proper waste sorting:

- Litterless lunches, have Waste Wizards on hand in the lunchroom during pizza lunches
- Reusable water bottles in the classroom
- Announcements about proper sorting
- Label bins and put posters up around the school, display on bulletin boards
- EcoClub members will show audience how to sort waste properly at assembly
- Recycling Bin Monitors are trained on proper waste sorting and hand out weekly
 We Recycle or OOPS tags
- Visit classrooms to review proper sorting

How can you reduce waste at your school?

Our EcoClub members said SAB can reduce waste at our school by sending a note home in student lunch bags about Litterless lunches. There will be more green bins available for food waste, at lunch and at recess and waste wizard to help sort waste on Fridays. We host an annual clothing drive in the Spring to minimise clothing waste.

Legacy Boundaries Review

I invite you to participate in the public consultation meetings to explore the Board's options for addressing the legacy technical and commercial boundaries that still exist in some parts of the city. The public consultations will be held between 6:30pm and 8:00pm on the following dates:

- Monday, January 15th
- Thursday, January 18th
- Sunday, January 21st

The schools with large legacy boundaries include Central Technical School, Central Toronto Academy, Danforth Collegiate and Technical Institute, Northern Secondary School, Western Technical-Commercial School and to a lesser extent, Victoria Park Collegiate Institute.

These large regional boundaries were created at a time when students were streamed into academic or vocational programming and have outlived their intended purpose.

The Board is proposing that these legacy boundaries be dissolved to eliminate 'as-of-right' access to these schools for some parts of the city, while expanding access to all students in Toronto. Staff is proposing that the legacy boundaries be dissolved for admission in September 2025.


