SAB 100th Anniversary update - M. Kanalec

Few teachers have already signed up for certain ideas/activities

- Idea 1: Appoint Chantelle from La Muse Art Studio to design and develop an artwork consisting of Tile mosaic/ stained glass art to commemorate 100 years of SAB. Parent volunteers are requested to meet with Chantelle during her demo at SAB on the same day as the next council meeting (just prior to the council meeting). Mr. Kanalec will inform the parents through newsletter on Nov 29/30, and Council will put a call out on the Facebook group etc.
- Idea 2: Ian Bates' vegetable garden. Laura King has informally volunteered to care for the garden during the summer holidays. As well, partnering with the day care provides an opportunity to care for the garden when school is not in session. Another idea is to partner with the senior center across the street.
- Idea 3: Suggestions inspired by Humber college 100th anniversary celebrations were made - To dedicate a classroom to each decade of the 100 years i.e., 60s, 70s etc.
 Showcase art, photos, stories, music from those years/decades; kids and parents and alumni dress to mimic the decade, fun song/music for the decade;
- Idea 4: Find out if there was a time capsule ever made, and add to it or else make a new 100 year capsule; Contact a local historian who can add archive materials; ask grandparents/parents in the community for stories/archive materials;
- Idea 5: For the celebrations, Food truck for kids and parents rather than do the BBQ led by council members. Consider using the Legion to host the food & drinks. Find out if there is a celebrity alumni who can make an appearance





Ask: Form a Centennial planning committee to plan and participate in implementing the plan Other ideas: combine with spring concert; plant trees and plaques; dinner & dance

Feedback on online appointment booking for teacher meetings

- General feedback was positive
- There were certain glitches with regards to start time being before school dismissal time. Attributed to growing pains
- Teachers to make sure the time slots don't start before school ends or that the teachers remain available for the slots offered to parents.

- Good number of volunteers have signed up; still looking for a Gym leader volunteer (for all games combined since each game is either run by the company staff or student volunteers)

Fundraising update:

• Suman - \$6700 from Big Box of Cards



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- Tracy Final numbers are not in yet, approx. \$12-13K from Chocolate Almonds
- Discussion on the new fundraisers with teachers revealed that the partnership worked very well during the campaign, but chasing the parents for outstanding boxes/orders through the teachers generated a bit of friction. Idea was floated to run these major fundraisers through a committee rather than individual leaders next time. Name checks/matching was a challenge for all fundraisers, especially when checks bounced.
- No Poinsettia, or Purdy's for now. Purdy's will be revisited in the Spring.
- Council to consider alternating between Big Box of Cards and Maple Syrup for fundraising.
- Grade 5 moving on fundraising and plan needs to be fully aligned with the teachers interests and appetite (e.g., past rituals include harbourfront visit, Marie Curtis beach but because of fatigue and risk level; it has been scaled back to Marie Curtis park and ice-cream truck)
- Attendee asked if council could spend money on Math materials Jump Math materials; better quality consumable books for students. This was implemented successfully at certain Peel region schools.

Budget update by Melissa Churchill-Smith

- Melissa presented the proposed budget for SY 2019-20 with adjustments to factor the inflation or other discretionary incremental allocations to classrooms/teachers.
- She also noted that lunch programs aren't as profitable as projected in the past years; however, are offset by better than expected profits from the two fundraisers this year.
