Ontario Secondary School Diploma Requirements

- · Successful completion of literacy requirement
- · 40 hours of community involvement
- · 30 credits: (18 compulsory and 12 optional)
- 4 English, one per grade level
- French as a second language
- 3 Mathematics, at least one in Grade 11 or 12
- 2 Science
- Canadian geography
- 1 Canadian history
- 1 Arts (dance, drama, media, music, visual arts)
- Health and physical education
- 0.5 Civics
- 0.5 Career studies

Plus one credit from each of the following groups:

Group 1: an additional English credit

LITERACY REQUIREMENT

Students must write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT), which is created and marked by EQAO.

Students who write the OSSLT and who have been unsuccessful at least once are eligible to take the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course (OLC40).

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Students must complete a minimum of 40 hours of community involvement prior to graduation.

- An indication of completion will be entered on the student's Ontario Student Transcript when the 40 hours have been submitted.
- The selection and management of the involvement is to be directed by the student and approved by the secondary school.
- · Activities may take place inside or outside the school. If inside, activities may not be part of a credit program.
- · The student may not displace a worker who would normally have been paid to perform the same function.
- Community involvement may begin in the summer after Grade 8.
