

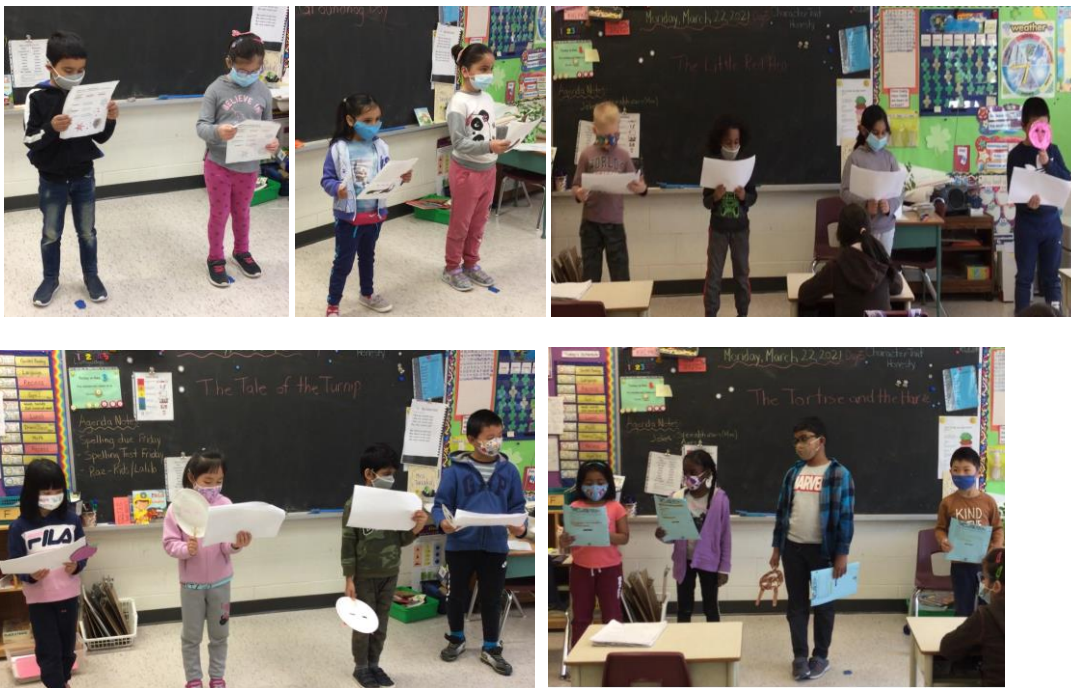

Sikh Heritage Month at the TDSB: Invitation to attend the Virtual Launch

Sikh Heritage Month is proudly recognized at the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) during the month of April. On March 22, 2016, the Board of Trustees voted to designate April of each year as Sikh Heritage Month, making the TDSB the first school board in Canada to do so, and matching recognition by the province of Ontario who proclaimed the Sikh Heritage Month Act in December 2013. This year our theme is Growing our Future: The Legacy of Sikh Farmers. Sikh Canadians have lived in Ontario since the turn of the twentieth century. They have made significant contributions to the growth and prosperity of Ontario and their traditions and culture continue to be a vibrant part of every aspect of our current life today. This includes many Sikh families who participate in farming throughout Canada.
