

#### **COVID-19 Child Benefit**

The new <u>COVID-19 Child Benefit</u> announced in the <u>2021 Ontario Budget</u> will provide direct payments to families and students to help with additional costs during the COVID-19 pandemic.

If you received a payment through the Support for Learners program, you do not need to apply. Starting on April 26, 2021, the government will begin issuing additional payments of:

- \$400 for each child or youth up to Grade 12
- \$500 for each child or youth up to age 21 with special needs
- If you missed applying for the Support for Learners program, you will have the opportunity to apply for this new round of payment. Applications will open from May 3, 2021 to May 17, 2021.

### Poster Contest for Children's Mental Health Week - Due April 30th, 2021

Child and Youth Services team have come together to organize a <u>Poster Contest for Children's Mental Health Week</u>—the deadline for submission is April 30th, 11:59 p.m. and the winners will be announced on May 7th. Theme for this year's contest is "My Tool Kit". Students are being asked to share their coping strategies that helped them to stay well through this unprecedented school year. #### **Spelling Bee of Canada 2021 Competition**

<u>Spelling Bee of Canada</u> is pleased to announce that registration for its 2021 Competition is now open. Participation is voluntary and extracurricular. Students who join will be supported by their teachers, mentors and volunteer coaches, but we will also need a commitment from the parent/guardian to encourage their child/children to study on their own on a regular basis.

Registration is open from April 1st to May 31st, 2021 and the price per child ranges from \$40.00 for the basic package to \$85.00 for the expert package. Each registrant receives the official spelling E-study guide in pdf format for their age category and the opportunity to compete in the local virtual chapter spelling bee competition. Higher tiers also include additional study resources and access to coaching and events – the accompanying registration form gives each package's full details.

Regional competitions will take place online during July and August 2021. Every child will receive a participation certificate. The 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place finishers in each age category will receive cash prizes and medallions. The 1st place winner from each category will be eligible to participate in the Online Championship Final on October 3, 2021.

The Spelling Bee programme has three age categories: Primary (ages 6-8, born 2012-2014), Junior (ages 9-11, born 2009-2011), and Intermediate (ages 12-14, born 2006-2008). Students will be placed in one of the three categories based on their age as of December 31, 2020.

Every year the children are asked to nominate their unsung hero and write an essay, the topic for the essay this year is" How do you stay connected with friends, family and loved ones during the pandemic? The instructions will be listed in each e-study guide per category.
