School Updates



STEM Competition Update

Two teams put St. Margaret's PS on the map when they competed at the TDSB Ontario Skills Qualifier this past March at L'Amoreaux Collegiate! With teamwork and determination, students used the skills that we have been practising in our new STEAM Lab to build a structure that can lift plastics out of our oceans. Scoring in the high 90's out of 100, both the Junior team - Parker (Gr. 5), Nomesh (Gr. 5), Ahahilla (Gr. 5), and Selena (Gr. 5) - and the Intermediate team - Faijul (Gr. 7), Shaan (Gr. 7), Keyana (Gr. 8), and Sidartha (Gr. 8) - came short only a few points behind the team that continued to the next round. They gave it their all, and we are so proud! Here's what they have to say about their experience.

"This was a wonderful experience. This experience included many parts that I enjoyed greatly. For example, the competitiveness, the learning experience, and teamwork. Science is one of my passions and going on this trip has made me more confident about what I want to do for the future." ~ Faijul (Gr. 7)

"My experience was awesome. In the beginning, the challenge seemed hard when the judges gave us one hour to draw our design. But they really liked our design. We felt confident building. We started off strong, but the wood glue didn't dry quickly enough by the end of the challenge. So we had to hold it up while we tested our structure. We were still proud because our team worked hard, and we worked well together." ~ Nomesh (Gr. 5)

"My experience was good. It wasn't too hard to come up with an idea because we practised building a similar structure during our class time with Ms. Kim and Ms. Bailey in the STEAM lab. But when we started to build, it was getting difficult. But there were nice judges to help us. One of the judges named Lucas was there to give us good ideas, so we wouldn't struggle too much. I can tell they really wanted all the students to succeed." ~ Ahahilla (Gr. 5)

"My experience was good. The challenge was more difficult than we expected when we were practising. But we came up with a really good design and started building a strong structure to hold our pulley system. A kid from another group must have liked our design because he ran to his group to tell them what to do. Near the end we had only 2 minutes left and our wood glue wasn't dry. We decided just to use hot glue, but that was a bad idea. We panicked, but we did manage to put the pieces back in place. It was a good learning experience. We learned not to panic at the end and finish what you can finish." ~ Selena (Gr. 5)

"I learned a lot from this experience. I learned that hot glue does not work with wood and I learned that I am good at cutting wood. I am also good at building, safety, and staying positive for my group. I was so determined to win, but we didn't win eventually. But I would do this again. It helped me realize what I am good at." ~ Parker (Gr. 5)
