January ECO Club Clothing Drive

The ECO club at The Waterfront School is holding a clothing drive with the organization **bag2school**. This organization recycles clothing and the school earns a small amount by weight of clothing donated.

We encourage you to think about our drive, as you organize your closets this winter. All men's, women's and children's clothing is welcomed, including backpacks, scarves, purses, belts, hats, towels, handbags etc. Each student is challenged to donate 2 bags each, but no amount is too big or small.

The reason the Eco Club is organizing this event is to bring awareness and change. Some facts driving our cause are:

- Did you know 80% of unwanted clothing is dumped in landfills?
- Making one pair of jeans emits the same amount of carbon dioxide as driving a car 115 km.

But guess what? Almost 100% of textile waste is recyclable.

So bring your clothing to school in plastic bags and drop them off down the stairs on the first floor by the hall to the gym. The last day is **January 29**.



Remember to label your child's belongings.


It is important to label your child's clothing so that it does not get mixed up with other children's' items. Students may have similar or the same things such as shoes or boots and when there is a name on the clothing or backpack it makes it easy to return it to a student. It only takes a moment to put on a name and it can make a big difference.

Snuggle Up And Read

It was wonderful to have so many parents and children join us for our "Snuggle Up And Read" event led by our speech pathologists Kirstin Boucher. As part of our early literacy intervention program Ms. Boucher has been working with our grade 1/2 students and teachers. Focussing on the needs of the students, they are using targeted strategies to increase students' reading. During her presentation Ms. Boucher talked about how language skills develop in young children and strategies that parents can use before, during and after reading. Each child went home with a brand new book to enjoy.
