
Kindergarten Registration

Registration for Junior Kindergarten has begun. Registration is by appointment only so please call the school to book a time to register your child. Children who are turning four before December 31, 2020 qualify for Junior Kindergarten. Children who turn five before December 31, 2020 qualify for Senior Kindergarten.

Team is a big part of our skill building to create our positive climate at The Waterfront School. Here are some of our kindergarten students demonstrating their teamwork leadership.




Supply Lunchroom Supervisors Needed

All of our students participated in a school bus safety presentation from our transportation consortium, school board and Ministry of Education. Secondary Program Review

The Toronto District School Board (TDSB) is undertaking a review of secondary schools to ensure all students have equitable access to programs and opportunities, as close to home as possible. As part of the <u>Secondary Program</u> <u>Review</u>, the TDSB is reviewing the Optional Attendance policy (P013), which allows students to apply to schools other than their designated school by home address.
