Student Timetables for 2016-2017

Proper course placement is critical for success.

Summer School

By now, many students have registered for summer school. Final deadline to enroll in day classes is June 29, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. There are three sessions offered this summer:

- Summer day school runs from Tuesday, July 5 to Friday, July 29 from 8:45 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. for full credit courses, half the day for remedial credits, at various locations across the city. Regular attendance and punctuality are mandatory. Family vacation plans cannot be accommodated. Students who do not attend the first day of class forfeit their place.
- July e-Learning courses begin July 4, 2016. Registration is now closed.
- August e-Learning courses begin August 2, 2016. Registration closes July 18, 2016.

- Students can only enroll in one full credit summer course at a time.
