Math At T.C.I.

We work as a **math team** to make sure that an **inclusive** and **respectful** learning environment is created for all students. **Real life applications are incorporated in everyday math learning**. Furthermore, new technological applications are applied so students are **motivated** and **develop higher order thinking** and **mathematical skills**.

The Math Class

At the beginning of the school year, all grade 9 students do diagnostic assessments to see where they are at with regards to their mathematics learning. **Students that have unfinished learning are supported by their classroom teacher, the Student Success department and other professional teams in the school**.

Math classes are 75 minutes long and run on a semestered system (two day cycle). All math students have access to technology that help enhance their classroom experience.

Gifted, Enriched & Advanced Placement (AP) Program

Our Mathematics Department offers numerous Gr 9 – 12 math courses, including gifted (Gr 9-11), enriched (Gr 11) and AP (Gr 12) math courses. Students can apply in Gr 10 to be part of the enriched program.

Math Contests

Every year, our students participate in the University of Waterloo (C.E.M.C) Math Contests. Students interested in learning and solving problems beyond the regular mathematics curriculum tend to transfer these skills and knowledge to their math courses to achieve greater results.

Supporting Math Learning

We offer EXTRA MATH HELP which is a great option for ALL students to enhance their math skills & knowledge. All math teachers are available before school, at lunch and/or after school (specific teacher dates & times are posted on the Math Office door & across from the Guidance office).

In addition to help from our faculty, students can **maximize their learning** opportunities via the **various learning management systems** and **apps** listed below.



If students need further assistance, there is help available from our **Afterschool Numeracy Program** and the **Braeburn Neighbourhood Place Afterschool Program** (which happens in T.C.I). Our Afterschool Numeracy Program is overseen by a math teacher, primarily with a focus on getting kids ready for the **EQAO**. The Braeburn program is run by tutors who are senior T.C.I. kids that provide one-on-one assistance to students needing help in math (and other subjects).
