# SickKids Rapid Testing School Program

The *Hospital for Sick Children* is pleased to provide COVID-19 Saliva Testing Program in partnership with Topcliff.

Under this program, the *Hospital for Sick Children* offers FREE COVID-19 saliva test kits for symptomatic staff, students, and household members, or those who have been identified by Toronto Public Health (TPH) as a high risk/close contact of a confirmed COVID-19 positive case.

A non-symptomatic family member can pick up a kit from the school office. The saliva test is simple to do at home. Just complete the form that is included in the kit and return it with the kit back to the school. The drop-off station is at the front doors of the school.

If the results are positive you will receive a phone call from Toronto SickKids. With your child's OHIP number, you can access the results online.

This is a great strategy to control the spread of the virus in the community.
