
A reminder that Friday, January 18th is a PA Day and there will be no school for students that day.

Kindergarten Registration

Registration for all TDSB Kindergarten programs begins in February. We look forward to

welcoming you and your child at our school in September. For registration, parents have the option of beginning the registering process on line at www.tdsb.on.ca/kindergarten. If you prefer to register in person, that option is still available. If you choose to register on line, you still need to come in to the school and bring the required documentation.



In order to register please bring: proof of age (a birth certificate, birth registration or passport), 2 current pieces of proof of residence in this school area, your immunization record and health card.

Punctuality

It is important that students arrive on time for school as this has a direct impact on their educational outcomes. The first bell rings at 8:25a.m. where students should be in their lines ready to enter. After that the doors will be locked and students need to enter through the front doors and get a late slip. Administration will continue to follow up with parents if lates or attendance becomes an issue.

Student Drop Off

A reminder to parents to please say 'goodbyes' at the door. It is important to foster your child's independence by letting them walk into the school to get to their classroom in order to start the morning of learning.

Picking Up Students/Dropping off Lunches

" Late lunches need be dropped off at the office before 11:15a.m." Please remember to put a note in your child's agenda if you need to pick them up early or you need to take them out for an appointment. If your child is outside at recess, teachers will send them to the office once all the children are back in the classroom and recess has ended. Late lunches need be dropped off at the office before 11:15a.m.

Wintery Weather

Occasionally severe weather conditions may require the Toronto District School Board to cancel transportation or to close schools. This may occur before the beginning of the school day or if conditions become severe during the school day. Those students in grade 6 who have had their parents sign the severe weather form will be dismissed during the day if schools are closing.

In the event that schools are closed, please keep your children home. The decision to close schools is made by the Director of Education. decimals, estimate decimal sums, differences, products, and quotients, add, subtract, multiply, and divide decimals to thousandths, pose and solve problems involving decimal operations and select operations and solve multistep problems. As always, we will focus on problem-solving skills and solution explanations. An assessment will follow once the students have had plenty of practice in these skills



Health: We are currently talking about alcohol and substance abuse and a variety of ways to deal with peer pressure.

Art-Project on Artist: Students will research an artist and adopt his/her style to produce an artwork. Students will use library resources such as books and information technology to research.
