### LIFE THREATENING ALLERGIES

Within our school community there are several students who have potentially life threatening allergies (anaphylaxis) to nuts and seafood. Smelling even a trace amount or coming in contact with a nut product can result in anaphylactic shock. Staff have been trained on the use of the Epi-Pen. We also have a number of teachers who have been trained in First Aid.

We need your assistance in helping to make sure Valleyfield is a safe environment for our children. We are seeking your support in not sending lunches or snacks that contain any type of nut. *Birthday treats must say Peanut/Nut Free Product* on the packaging.

# PROFESSIONAL LEARNING COMMUNITIES (PLC'S) FOR TEACHERS

Teachers at Valleyfield work together on a weekly/bi-weekly basis to discuss teaching and learning strategies that support the TDSB's 3 foci of equity, academic achievement and wellbeing for our students. The Kindergarten Division will be focussing on pedagogical documentation and how they can encourage student voice in their classrooms. The Primary Division and Junior Division are currently looking at our data (i.e. EQAO, Parent/Student Census, Report Cards) to get to know the our students and families and support academic achievement.

## REMEMBRANCE DAY ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION CONTEST

All Valleyfield students are encouraged to participate in the Royal Canadian Legion Remembrance contest. The deadline for submissions is Monday November 12th. ### Ms. Rattner's Grade 2

Language: In grade 2 we continue to develop a love of literature and work on building fluency and comprehension skills. In September we worked on building our reading stamina. We can read for a whole 10 minutes without getting up or moving. We are also working on vowel sounds and doing some fun activities to help us

learn. We have been writing recounts with partners and on our own.

Math: This term (September-November), our class will focus on: Reciting, reading and writing numbers 0-50 and beyond. Skip counting by 2,5,10 to 50 and beyond. We are also developing strategies for recalling math facts to 18 through a variety of math games.

<u>Social Studies:</u> We are learning about the different types of families. We'll be creating a family tree.

### Ms. Mishos' Grade 2/3

The boys and girls in Ms. Mishos' Grade 2 & 3 class have been very busy since the start of school. In Language, they have been learning how to produce a piece of recount writing. They have already written about their summer memories and are currently working on their own autobiographies. In Math, the class just completed a unit on Number Sense and are now beginning to work on Data Management. They are learning how to ask survey questions, interpret and display the data that they have collected. In Art, the children began the year by painting special rocks collected from the shores of Lake Ontario and placing them under a tree in front of the school to show their appreciation for nature

and the environment.

### **Sports Update**

We had 43 students in grades 2 to 6 participating in the west qualifying cross-country meet on October 3rd. They had a wonderful time and did a great job representing our school. Special congratulations go out to Willow in M. Alexandre's grade 4 French Immersion class who moved on to the West Conference Finals. We are very



proud of her! Twenty-five boys and girls in grades 5&6 represented our school at soccer tournaments the week of October 15th. The weather agreed with them and the fought hard while being good ambassadors of Valleyfield JS. Well done! Unfortunately, there was not enough interest for our boys grades 4&5 volleyball team with Ms. Malenkovich. Girls volleyball season is later on.

### Mr. Choudhri's Grade 3/4

Students have been very busy in our Grade 3/4 class since September.

**Reading:** During October, we are looking at two reading strategies: Making Connections and Determining Importance. While reading at home, students are encouraged to make text to text, text to self, and text to world connections to their text. They should also be trying to understanding the main idea of a text and the important details.

Writing: We are learning how to come up with ideas as a writer, organizing these ideas, and writing our narrative paragraphs using proper paragraph structure. The students are focusing on writing traits that make them better writers. We are trying to incorporate the six writing traits (Ideas/Content, Conventions, Organization, Word Choice, Voice, and Sentence Fluency) as well as The Writing Process for our paragraph writing.



Math: We are currently working on Number patterns after finishing our Place Value unit. For these units, Grade 4's are expected to describe, extend, and create a variety of numeric patterns, and make predictions related to the patterns. They also need to demonstrate an understanding of equality between pairs of expressions, using addition, subtraction, and multiplication. Grade 3's will need to describe, extend, and create a variety of numeric patterns as well as demonstrates an understanding of equality between pairs of expressions, using addition and subtraction of one- and two-digit numbers, using a variety of strategies and algorithms that are discussed in class.

Science: We will continue our Science unit on Habitats and Communities (Gr. 4) and Growth and Changes in Plants (Gr. 3).

<u>Social Studies:</u> We will continue our Social Studies on Canada's regions, provinces and territories (Gr. 4), and Living and Working in Ontario (Gr. 3).
