

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)

- 30 credits
 - 18 compulsory credits

What do you need to graduate? 18 compulsory credits Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma: credits in English (1 credit per grade)* credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12) credits in science. credit in Canadian history credit in Canadian geography credit in the arts credit in health and physical education credit in French as a second language 0.5credit in career studies 0.5 credit in civics Plus one credit from each of the following groups: group 1: additional credit in English, or French as a New second language,** or a Native language, or a classical or an international language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance New group 2: additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or French New group 3: additional credit in science (Grade 11 or 12), or technological education, or French as a second or computer studies, or cooperative education* In addition, students must complete: 12 optional credits[†] 40 hours of community involvement activities the provincial literacy requirement *A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course. **In groups 1, 2, and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3, ***A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits. +The 12 optional




Future Studies

Students in our Tech Courses have the opportunity to work hands-on in our fully equipped Auto & Woodworking Shops.







All students may apply for Out-of-Area Admissions.

The school may admit students from all of the priorities, as space is available.

Transportation is the responsibility of the applicant.

January 9, 2023 - Secondary Out-of-Area Admissions Online application opens

January 27, 2023 (4:00 p.m.) - Secondary Out-of-Area Admissions Online application closes

Acceptances Timelines

February 8, 2023 - Acceptances and waitlist status will be sent centrally, via email to all applicants. **Offers expire February 14, 2023 at 4:00 p.m.**

February 15, 2023 - Second round of Acceptances and waitlist status will be sent centrally, via email to all applicants. **Offers expire February 21, 2023 at 4:00 p.m.**

February 22, 2023 - Any final offers will be sent. All waitlists expire on this date. **Offers Expire on February 24, 2023.**

February 27, 2023 - TDSB students must finalize their acceptance by completing and submitting the corresponding course selection for the accepted school in myBlueprint
