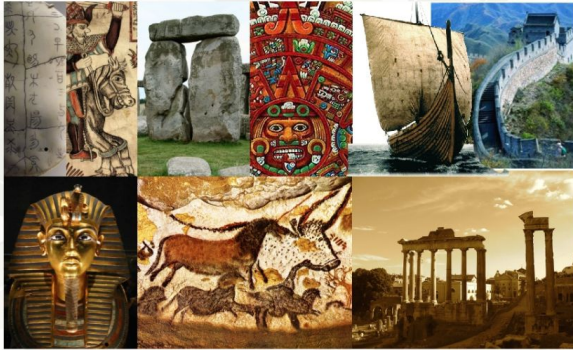

## *Grade 12 University Prep*

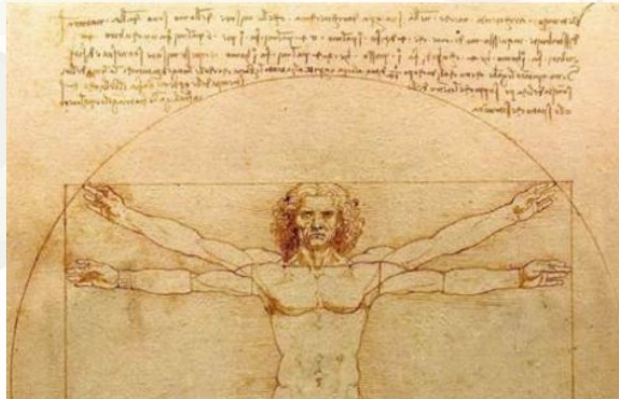
Explore Canadian and International law in social, political and global contexts studying historical sources of law and the practices of international law. Analyse legal issues relevant to today and tomorrow.
