Kinship:

யாதும் ஊரே யாவரும் ரேளி // Yaadhum Oore Yaavarum Kelir

To us, all towns are one, and all people are our kin

This is a quotation by an influential Tamil philosopher named Kaniyan Pungundranar who lived around the 6th century B.C.E.

The quotation represents a theme that is very important to Tamil people and Tamil culture - the theme of kinship and interconnectedness of all people. It emphasizes the idea that regardless of where we come from, we are all part of a larger family. This theme encourages us to celebrate diversity and foster unity within communities, highlighting that our differences enrich our shared human experience.

We invite all interested TDSB students to take part in this year's Tamil Heritage Month poster challenge. The challenge is an opportunity to create one of three posters that will be shared with TDSB schools and the public to represent this year's theme. Please use the above description and reflective prompts to guide you in creating an original design that will be considered to represent Tamil Heritage Month 2025.
