Students who are not up-to-date with their vaccinations or do not have a valid exemption can be suspended from school. **Please be sure to update your vaccine record with Toronto Public Health by March 31, 2025.** This year, TPH is assessing the vaccination records of Grade 11 students (born in 2008). So, students born in 2008 should make sure they have provided all the required information to TPH. Please see below for more information.

EQAO OSSLT

The Ministry of Education requires that the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) be written in person. There are no exceptions.

Successful completion of the OSSLT is a graduation requirement. A passing score is a Level 3, 70%, and meets the provincial standard.

A student must have attempted the test once and have been unsuccessful before they are eligible to take the Ontario Literacy Course (OLC). This is the course equivalent of the test. Passing this course (50%) can be used to meet the graduation requirement.

The test is written following the successful completion of Grade 9 English. Typically students write the OSSLT in their grade 10 year.

The Spring session at VSS is for grade 10 students and any student in grades 11 or 12 who has yet to successfully complete the test.

18+ Adult Student Consent to Share Information with Parents/Guardians

When a student turns 18 years old they are considered an adult under the Education Act. When the student turns 18 their parent/guardian no longer has access to student information. This includes school communications, report cards etc.

The default is No Consent when a student turns 18. <u>Students must complete and submit this</u> form for Parents/Guardians to continue to have access to information and/or receive messages/notifications from school.

This form will be sent by the VSS Main Office to student emails prior to their 18th birthday.

Reporting Student Vaccination Records

The Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA) requires students up to 17 years of age to receive certain vaccines or have a valid exemption. Students who fail to comply may face suspension. This year, Toronto Public Health (TPH) is assessing the vaccination records of Grade 11 students (born in 2008).



Students who are not up-to-date with their vaccinations or do not have a valid exemption can be suspended from school. Please be sure to update your vaccine record with Toronto Public Health by March 31, 2025.

Below is a message from Toronto Public Health.

Did You Know?

Parents and students 16 years of age* and older are responsible for reporting the student's immunizations to Toronto Public Health every time the student gets a vaccine to avoid suspension. Health care providers, such as doctors or nurses, are not required to report vaccines to TPH.

Here's what you need to do:

- 1. Check the student's yellow vaccine card to confirm required vaccines.
- If vaccines are needed, book a free vaccination appointment with a health care provider and report it to Toronto Public Health (TPH) via Immunization Connect Ontario (ICON): <u>toronto.ca/StudentVaccines</u>
- 3. If the student already got the required vaccines, report the vaccination record to Toronto Public Health through <u>Immunization Connection Ontario</u> (ICON) or call 416-338-7600 and press '2' for immunization services.
- 4. Letters will be sent directly to parents/students who may face suspension in Spring 2025.

*In accordance with the Personal Health Information Privacy Act, 2004, students 16 years of age or older are required to give consent directly to TPH if they want their parent or legal guardian to access or update their immunization record. Students can report the information themselves online at toronto.ca/StudentVaccines.
